

## **Nobody's Business**

Saw Santa Last Friday By Julian Capers Jr.

AUSTIN-The Legislature's definition of an "open saloon", under which the State Liquor Control board issues licenses to "beer joints" throughout the State, is Gerald Mann ruled, in answer to a request from Dr. J. A. Bradfield, veteran prohibition campaigner, and new chairman of the Liquor board. Dr. Bradfield questioned the legality of the definition enacted by the Legislature, but Mann advised him the courts will not invalidate a criminal law-no matter what they may think of its wisdom-so long as it does not contravene Constitutional provisions, and is clear and explicit in its verbage. The licensing law meets the test, Mann held.

#### **Culberson Opposes Smith**

Olin Culberson, veteran director of the Railroad Commission's Gas Utilities division, until he was ousted by Lon Smith and Jerry Sadler recently, will announce his candidacy as Railroad Commissioner soon after January 1, according to his close friends.
