
Terry County WPA Sewing Project

From October 28, 1939 to November 2, 1940 the Terry County ° WPA Sewing Project has employed an average of thirty persons per month. Eleven persons are now employed. 5352 garments have been made using 9719 yards of material. The average number of yards per garment was 1.8 yards. 9056 1-4 yards of WPA material were used. The cost of ma-, terial to WPA at 11c per yard was \$996.19. During this period the county furnished 662 3-4 yards of material costing \$83.25. The county also expended \$80.25 for utilities and \$602 for rental. Total W PA cost for labor amounts to \$6062.16.
