In 1932 the Journal condemned the sale and
use of bootleg milk, namely milk offered for
sale outside municipal limits and therefore
sal subject to the regulations governing the sale of milk within the municipality. Several Health officers at that time were confronted with the health hazard developed by the saie
of milk at roadside stands to residents nearby cities. Such milk was cheaper than milk sold in the city. Often it came from farms of such insanitary condition that their
products could not be offered for sale within the city limits.
