The Teachers of Young Amer

There seems to be no doubt that women are superceding men as teachers in the schools of the United States. As examination of the census shows that of the 150,241 teagliers in the co achools of the country, exactly 100,000 are wonien. In Massachusetts there are six times as many female as male teachers. In Vermont the proportion is five to one; in Iowa three to one. The dis-proportion is most marked in large cities. In New York there are only 178 male out of over 2,000 teachers; in Phil-adelphia, 83 in 1,3000; and a similar proportion prevails in all other cities. cause seems to be that few men are willcause seems to be that few men are willing to enter systematically a profession which nowhere holds out a higher salary than three thousand dollars, the average payment being 2,000 dollars per annum. A leading principal in New York believes that soon there will be only women teaching in the schools. The Board of Education in New York declares that the teaching by women is equally satistory with that by men, and the Board of Cincinnati says it is superior.
