UNITED STATES. Passed at the Second Session of the Fortieth Congress.

[PUBLIC RESOLUTION-No. 24.] JOINT RESOLUTION concerning certain lands granted to railroad companies in the States of Michigan and Wisconsin. Beit enacted by the Senate and House of Rep-

Approved, May 20, 1868.
