Hon. E J. Davis, President of the State convention, Sir: I respectfully submit the following minority report: I do not believe it either necessary or proper for this convention "to urge upon the Congress of the United States a change in the Reconstruction law, giving to this body the appointment of the boards of registrars in this State." It is a matter, in my judgment, over which the convention, as such, has no control. Created by the Reconstruction laws of Congress, it derives its power to act sole-ly from those laws, and any action that it might take, beyond the formation of a constitution, would be unanthorized. That its members, individually or collec-That its members, individually of congress tively, have a right to petition Congress as citizens, I do not question; but in its official capacity as a law making power, I do not think any such power exists, and such action. I would deem a diereapostful assumption, on our part, of the right to sit in judgment on the action of Congress. Again: The military commander, uninfluenced by local interests or prejudice, would be as likely, I think, prejudice, would be as likely, I think, to appoint impartial boards of registrare, as we, who are in a greater or less degree liable to these influences. For these and other reasons, I discent from the majority of the judiciary committee.
