What is butter? The word Butter is derived from the Greek Bouturon, which is from the two words, Bous, a Cow, and Turos, Cheese; or, more properly, Coagulum.

Butter is simply the oily part of milk, which, when separated from the other constituent parts—water, casein, sugar, &c.—adhere together and form a solid.

This process requires some experience. For if it is not properly conducted, the butter is unfit for market. For instance, if it is over an hour in being churned...

In India, butter is preserved by heat. The butter being heated and left pure in the form of oil, it is then strained and placed in air-tight bottles.

In Ireland a mixture is made, one part nitre, one part of sugar, and two parts of the best fine salt; and the flavor it imparts to the butter is said to be far superior to that cured by salt alone.
