AUSTIN CORRESPONDENCE

Austin, January 14th, 1869. Editor San Antonia Express

Since my last letter, the fight in the Convention upon the division of the State, has thickened. The debate upon the condition of the State was closed on the 12th Mr. Morgan Hamilton making the closing speech, which was full of good sense and patriotism.

Yesterday, the charter of the New Orleans, Mobile and Chatanooga railroad, came up and was passed to its third reading, The Central rail-road, like a dog in a manger, got up an opposition to this real line company, which proposes to extend its road to San Antonia in oned rection, and through Central Texas in the direction of Hardiman county. The Central was very active; its agent Jas. H. Rell, like Mephistopheles, was hand; while McCormick, like Faust, spoke the promptings of his uncle. But the Central was for the first time put "horse de combat," and the prospect is that Texas is to have a real line railroad company to operate within its borders, one that will be able to run a railroad at fares. low enough for the independent people of Texas to patronize it. Governor Flanders represents this enterprise and has done much by his sunvity and frankness of manners in placing his measure before the Con vention, and in overcoming the ma-

Your renders are aware that for over five weeks a minority under the lead of Jack Hamilton has "called the House upon the question of division. The call of the House is a demand that all the members be brought in who have no excuse to be absent Four members who have not re ported this session are away without excuse. Messrs. Foster and Cole man have left the State; Mr. Yarborough on account of age and ill health has not reported, and has signified he would never attend again; Mills, of El Paso, left the convention during the last s 2 sion in high disgust, without asking to be excused, because Montezuma Territory failed.

At the morning seasion yesterday

resolution was adopted appointing a special committee to inquire into the absence of Messrs. Foster, Yarborough, Coleman and Mills. Last night the committee reported the facts and suggested that the rules in relation to a "call of the House" be changed so that members who have not answered for five days previous to a call of the House shall not be counted. In the name and by the authority f the State of Austin:

The Grand Jurers of said county and State, tried, empannelled and aworn to enquire into and present offences committed against said State of Austin on their oath do present.
