HEPRESENTATIVE HALL, Jan., 15, 1869.

Sir: Your Special Committee appointed to anquise into the circumstances of the absence of Messrs.

Mills, Yarburough, Coleman, and Poster, have lad that matter under examination, and have made such enquiry, and received such evidence as satisfies the committee that Mr. enquiry, and received such evidence as satisfies the committee that Mr. Yarborrough's health and age have witherto prevented, and will continue to prevent his attendance upon the convention at the present session; that Messrs. Coleman and Foster are either not in the State, or if in it, their place of habitation is not known to those residing in the Districts represented by said delegates; and other avidence not proper to tricts represented by said delegates: and other evidence not proper to embody in this report, has satisfied the committee that said Coleman and Foster will not attend the present session of the convention, and cannot be brought in by the Sergent-at-arms, or a special Messenger. The committee believe that Mr. Mills has purposed attending this accision of the convention, but has hitherto probably been kept away by urgent private business, by the difficulty and danger of travel from El Paso to the Capitol at the time, and probably by stress of weather. That letters have been received from him by his friends here, indicating that he would arrive in Austin about that time.
