the Convention:

Sir: We, the undersigned delegates to the Constitutional Convention of the State of Texas, do hereby express our disapproval of the proposed constitution adopted by a majority of this Convention.

We object to it, because it is based upon the unwarranted assumption that the Constitution of the United States, with the treaties and laws made in pursuance thereof, and the accepted Constitution of the State of Texas, (of 1845,) have not been continuously the supreme law of the land. Believing, as we do, that all pretended laws and judicial decisions, made within the nation's Clerk be authorized to employ s never compromise this principle for vice any supposed policy.

We do most earnestly and solemnly protest against that provision in the proposed constitution which ex-tends the right of suffrage to all those who voluntarily became the public enemy of the United States; feeling assured that it was the aim of Con-gress to enable the loyal people of Texas, without regard to any distinction of race or color, to reorganize and maintain government in the place of that overthrown by the rebellion. And we cannot forbear to express the conviction that the adoption by the majority of the Convention of the provisions in regard to suffrage, was obtained by virtue of a premeditated and deliberate deception, and by methods of intimic convention:
