Under date April 17, the Madrid correspondent of the London Standard writes:
Castelar made a speech on the 12th, which has certainly raised him to the pinnicle of popularity, seldom attained thy any public man, in so short a space of time It was the more extraordinary, as it was unpremeditated, being in the shape of a reply to a long speech, delivered before it, by one of the dignitaries of the clerical party. Senter Manterola, the Canon of Vitoria. Castelar's masterly reply has taken the whole country by storm. In the streets, in the clubs, in the Committee-rooms of the Congress, in the railway trains, and in the Congress, in the railway trains, and in the press, scarcely anything else is talked about. Its percention was ceitainly one of the firmest and most effective oratorical efforts, to which I have ever listened; and efforts, to which I have ever listened; and produced the most extraordinary effect upon the centire Cortes. This will therefore work to the advantage of the country in two waysfirst, a stendy supply of gold, which must prevent the great fluctuations attendant upon a spasmodic supply; second, a constant withdrawal of a certain amount of mer from the market.
