The buildings all remain as they were when Jeff left, except a few negro quarters that have been torn down. An old negro that used to be one of Jeff's slaves, now leases the plantation of Joe for \$10,000 a year, and hires 150 hands to work it. Not a white man is to be seen about the place. Strange as it may seem to Mr. Davis, his old slave is making money fast, and feels as proud as any white man "libin in ole Jeff's parlor desc days." 
