An illustration of the fruit producing capacity of Western Texas, we will state that Mr. Paulsen grafted the tree into a peach tree stock in 1892. The next year the graft yielded seventy-two large and fine Apples, and has borne fruit yearly since.

A GREAT RAINFALL OF THE SUN.—Which is to take place on the 7th of August of this year, will be visible in the United States, and will commence on the morning of the above mentioned day, in the interior of Siberia, first taking a Northwesterly direction; thence taking an Eastern and Southwesterly course, crossing the Gulf of Mexico, and will be visible in Alaska at noon. Thence passing through a part of British America, touching the United States between 3 and 5 o'clock, P. M., westwardly taking the direction of Michigan, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, central Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina and the islands of Bermuda. The Eclipse will be visible all over the United States, extending over a surface of more than 1,000 miles on the line above indicated. Its duration will be one hour and 57 minutes.—El Atalaya.
