The importance of securing to our city the position nature has entitled it to, has never been so forcibly felt as during the last few months; when threats of the removal of all the military depots to another point convinced our people that a railroad to the coast would save us. Some of our wealthy citizens, without regard to politics, with commendable zeal organized an Association to forward our railroad interests-our people were called on to contribute towards the expense of agents, etc., to which they responded liberally; but now there is a calm-the association after sending a committee abroad, concluded nothing could be done until after reconstruction. This conclusion is to be regretted as the temporary excitement raised here has caused our rivals to redouble their energies. With all due defference to the conclusion of the committee, much can be done before reconstruction-a railroad, even, can be built, or at least such thorough preparation made, as will secure us a railroad to the coast inside of one year. One great mistake we desire to point out in the beginning, to be avoided by our citizens-that is, be careful not to let a party calling itself a special railroad party spring up, encouraged by your desire for railroads. No such party ever yet succeeded, it has only been through the influence of great political parties that legislation has been brought to bear favorably towards Internal Improvements. The Re publican party is the great railroad party of the nation; to it belongs the credit of that great enterprise, the Pacific railroad, and not satisfied with one great national highway, it is contemplated to build others by the aid of the Govern-ment. THE flow of emigration to the United States still continues very heavy. During the first five months of the present year the unmber of emigrants landing in New York was 114,683, or thirty per cent. greater than for the correspondent part of the year 1868. German emigration thus far this year has taken the lead, the number of Irish being not half so large as that of the persons coming from the different German States.
