DESPATCHES TO THE EXPRESS

Washington, Aug. 9.
Cubans here have the following semiofficial statement regarding the Cuban forces: The army has been thoroughly organized instead of being scattered through the country in bands of two or three thou sand. The forces have been concentrated and formed into regular brigades, and di-visions, sesser tried officers. Diseases been formed into two army corps designated as the Army of the East and West Gen. Thomas Jordan, formerly of the Con-federate army and Chief of Beauregard's staff, commands the first, and Gen. Quesa da, the second.

The command of Jordan is composed of 3600 filibuster volunteers, 10,000 Cubans, and nearly the same number of liberated slaves; 9000 of this force is well armed and organized. Jordan's troops have been remarkably free from discase / hmonil 10

The Army of the West is composed mostly of Cubans and slaves liberated by Cospedes. The number is over 20,000,—10,000 Americans or volunteers, 9,000 Cubans, 1800 deserters from the Spanish army, the balance liberated slaves.

McRea, one of the leaders of a band of Ku Klax in Eastern Texas, has been killed. The Waco Register says:

It appears from what we can learn, that McRae, with some of his fellowers, entered the town of Belton, and fred upon some of its citizens. A rally of citizens took place, when McRae was attacked, and after he had carptied four six-shooters at his pursuers, wounding a man named McDonald badly in the knee, he received in his body the contents of a couble-barrel gup, (buckshot) from the effects of which he immediately died. One of his followers was wounded, but made his escape.

The parties who killed McRae went to Wace and procured a squad of ten soldiers. It appears from what we can learn, that

Two days before the killing of McRae, Lieut. Holt, 6th cavalry, stationed at this Post, visited Bell county for the purpose of capturing or killing this band. Came up with them on Little River, near McRae's house. After exchanging shots the McRae band succeeded in making their escape.—Lieut. Holt then left orders with a few citizens to kill or capture these men. He returned to this Post with his detachment. The next day the killing took place.

A Washington dispatch says the result of Gov. Boutwell's ad-ministration of the Treasury Department appears in a proposition from a German house in Frankfort to loan our Government three hundred million dollars at five per cent., which the Secretary has of course, been obliged to decline. His riew is, that we may within a year borrow all the money we want at four per cent., or certainly at four and a half per cent, and the pre-sent indication seems to be, though it is not intended to speak in his name, that he will next winter ad-vise such a loan for the purpose of paying off the five twenties, or whenever the government chooses to so consider them. A private letter, not to the Secretary, from well advised sources in England, expresses the opinion that a bond at four and a quarter per cent, can easily be nego tiated in Europe within six or eight

months. There will be no difficulty in pay ing the whole debt in twenty years if the interest be reduced in this wise upon the bonds, and the revenues collected tairly, econimically and honestly.

Poisonors Bona Pountains, Dr. Clen diene, who was recently commissioned by da fountains, reports that out of the hundred specimens examined, fourteen con tained copper and ten lead, making twenty-four poisonous. From his description of what is necessary in the way of foun tains, pipes, &c., to keep soda water pare we predict there is little or none sold South that is not poisonous. The fountain should be enamelled, but enamelled fountains cannot be transported. A heavy conting of tin may be substituted. All the pipes should be of tin, no copper or lead should be allowed in contact with the sods.

There is no difficulty in ascertaining the

condition of soda water. By adding a few drops of the solution of reflow prussiate of potash to a glass of the suspected, soda water, placed on a white paper, no change is seemsioned if it is pure; but if even a null quantity of copper is present, a shade of purplish brown is produced and readily appreciated by looking down in the glass. The pressure of lead is readily detected by adding to the suspected liquid a few grains of the ioslide of potassium, which if lend is present, produces a yellow tint.
