

Registration.

The most important preliminary to the coming election is the Registration of the voters of the State. In fact the cause of Reconstruction depends upon this Registration and we have no doubt but our military Commander is now perfecting his arrangements to carry it out properly.

The first Registration, under fren Griffia, was well conducted. Com petent and reliable supervisors were selected to carry out the appoint ment of proper Boards, composed of citizens. These Boards were impartially chosen, and the result of the first Registration was satisfactory. Complete instructions were given, and we believe, it can be truthfully said, that the spirit and intent of the Reconstruction law was generally carried out.

All depends upon proper Boards of Registration. Men who know the spirit and intent of the Reconstruction law, and have the courage and desire to enforce it. It may be urged that the appointment of radical loyal men would be too plainly partial and one-sided. The law is one-sided, it is made to favor the Joya! men; it is a partial act with the purpose of placing the political power of the State in the hands of the radical loyal men, to the exclusion of those who have held office under the Confederate Government. In order that the Reconstruction law be properly administered in the matter of Registration it must be entrusted to the hands of straight out Republicani m. Griffin and Gen. Sheridan understood this matter and made the Registration Boards almost arbitrary, even giving them the right to reject applicants whom they knew to be opposed to the Government and insincere in entitled to register.

An appeal is always open to the military commander, where parties ensider themselves agrieved.

Boards must be made of stern material, as there will be a desperate at tempt on the part of those who were refused at the last Registration, to register; oaths will be no barrier; and the Registrars must be continually on the watch to keep out persons who will insist upon taking the oath.

The appointment of mixed Boards, that is, mixed in politics, with a military officer to preside, as was done in Virginia, would in our opinion be disastrous in Texas. The appointment of military officers on Boards in certain localities will be wise and necessary, but wherever a military officer is placed on a Board he should be flanked by Radical Republicans. We mean no disparage ment when we say there are few of fficers who are partial enough to enforce the Reconstruction law; their business is war, not peace, and there is a general tendency on their part to display a great deal of what is called, magnanimity towards the

Call for Primary Meetings in military men who rise to the situation of our political condition. And we believe the General will make a mistake if he divides the Registration Boards between the Republicans and the so-called conservatives with an officer to preside. A military officer and the ballance of the Board, Republicans will do. One advantage of military men, they obey instructions, and Gen. Rey nolds could be so explicit that there could be little room to make mis takes.

As this is the all important preliminary work we feel full confidence that Gen. Reynolds will leave nothing undone to secure a proper Registration, and our remarks are only intended to awaken attention to a subject of so great magnitude and vital interest to the whole community.
