### Death of Senator Pessenden.

Wednesday's dispatches nounced the death of Gen. Rawlins; Thursday's, the death of Wm. Pitt Fessenden. The name and fame of Senator Fessenden is world-wide; America. He was born in New 1806, and consequently was nearly 63 years of age, at the time of his death. He was a regular colegiate graduate and entered the practice of law in Portland Maine in 1829. In 1831 he was elected to the Maine Legislature, and although the youngest member he won the repu tation of being a brilliant and able orator. He was a staunch whig in politics, and in 1840 was prevailed upon to give up his splendid practice and run as the whig Candidate for Congress; be was elected and made his mark in the important debates of those times - From 1845 to 1852 he devoted himself to his profession and was associated with Daniel Webster in an important case before the Supreme Court in relation to the responsibilities of auctioners. Mr. Fessenden's speech on the case won the admiration of the most fastidious Judges. From 1852 to 1854 Mr. Fessenden took an active and important part in the politics of the nation and in the latter year was elected by the joint ballot of the whigs and freesoil Democrats of the Maine Legislature, to the United States Senatorship. This was the origin of the Republican party in Maine. in 1859 Mr. Fessenden was again elected to the United States Scuate. 
