Our Frontier Protection.

The peoples of other States, and particularly those east of the Mississippi River, are unquestionably ignorant of the general feeling of uneasiness and insecurity of life and property along our frontier.

The Congress of the United States do not have the facts forced upon them in a manner to command its attention and action.

In the election of General Davis to the Governorship, our people see relief from the petty tyrannies, the fear and the disgrace of Bacon's shameful rule; elements of discord are rendered powerless, and safety, harmony and kindly feelings will prevail among the people of this frontier.

With this state of the case, we beg leave to suggest to the press at large, a course which, we believe, will prove effective in influencing the government.

Let there be appointed in every frontier county a committee to take affidavits, with properly authenticated proofs, of every murder, or other outrage committed in that county, say since 1866; and let these be placed properly before our legislature, which will, unquestionably, present to Congress the facts, with regard to our frontier, in such a manner as to command the respect and prompt action of the general government.

We may also add, that we have information from the Hon. Chairman of the committee on Territories, in Congress, that as soon, at least, as our State government is organized so that our State Executive can act in this matter, the whole subject will be urgently forced upon the attention of Congress.

Editor From El Paso - The Late Election - Gratifying Results - Masonic Ceremonies - Railroad Prospects.

El Paso, Jan. 15, 1870.

As the smoke and dust of the late political struggle in this State clear away, and earnest Republicans survey the field, and see the

result, it would, indeed, be strange, if they did not rejoice over the glorious victory they gained—a victory over rings, intrigue and corrupt political combinations.

The victory of Republicanism in Texas is no ordinary victory, and that it is regarded by the lovers of liberty, not alone with a feeling of triumph and exultation, but also with deep emotions of gratitude and thankfulness, is sufficiently evident from the earnest but subdued notes of triumph which arise in every part of the State.

Not alone is patriotism safe and secure in Texas, now, but something is gained to the country and cause of human freedom. Devotion to the Union is no longer cause for persecution, and love of country no longer a crime. Patriotism gives a sigh of relief, and with tears of thankfulness it blesses God for the result.

It is, indeed, pleasant and gratifying to know that El Paso county has bravely done its part, toward securing the grand result which sends joy to all patriotic hearts. Out of the 461 votes polled in this county General Davis received 336, while the gallant DeGeneres received 219 majority, about three times his majority in the entire district.

Aside from the general feeling of gratification, which pervades the hearts of our citizens in this county, there are particular reasons attaching to the grand result which make victory doubly dear. With this victory comes a feeling of safety and security to which our citizens have been strangers for several years past.

There is no safety to a people, when ignorance and corruption are united in the Judge who disgraces the bench where impartiality and justice should preside. The feelings of contempt for, and lack of confidence in William F. Bacon is deep-seated and all pervading. While his gross ignorance of the law is patent to all, it is believed, by those well informed, that he is shamelessly corrupt, while his petty tyrannies and open partiality are a humiliation to the bar and a disgrace to the bench.

THE MAILS.—After next Tuesday, we are informed, there will be a daily mail to San Antonio to Columbus. Every other day the mail will be brought by sulky, which, being unnumbered by other weight, will no doubt deliver the mails more promptly and regularly than has been done heretofore. The irregularity of arrival of mail matter, which has prevailed with us hitherto, as for instance, receiving to-day the latest package, and on the next stage a package two weeks old, is a nuisance which not only newspaper conductors, but business men generally, will be glad to see abated.

HUMBOLDT ZEITUNG.—Our citizens will perhaps remember the Humboldt Festival held in our city on the 19th of September last, in honor of the centenary birth-day of the great German philosopher, Alexander von Humboldt; we say German philosopher, simply because he was a German by birth; but all civilized people are proud to claim him as Cosmopolitan, because he devoted his great talents to the promotion of science throughout the whole world, and was never restrained by local pride or prejudice. America, in particular, delighted to do him honor. In every city in this country, the 19th of September was celebrated with more or less enthusiasm. In our city, something unusually sensible and beneficial was undertaken under the lead of our excellent Mayor, Mr. W. C. A. Thalepape, which was the founding of a free school, by public subscription. Our German citizens, aided in some degree, but we regret to say, not to such an extent as the merits of the cause deserved, by a few public spirited native citizens, raised a considerable amount of money, and Tuesday the corner stone of a new building was placed in rear of the German English school building. All honor to those who have contributed to this laudable enterprise; and we hope to see the example followed out until San Antonio can boast of the best institutions of learning in the State.

Headquarters 5th Military Dist. (State of Texas.) ANTONIO, TEXAS, Dec. 15, 1869. GENERAL ORDERS, No. 533. It appears from the records of the Comptroller's Office, that sales for the tax due for the years 1867 and 1868, under the intricate and stringent provisions of the

Act for the assessment and collection of taxes approved November 1866, of nearly eight million seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars, principally by "unauthorized" brought into the Treasury the insignificant sum of less than \$6000; and as the greater portion of these lands are supposed to be the property of minors, widows, and non-residents, who have scarcely had time since the close of the rebellion, to re-appoint proper agents; and as the state of the Treasury does not require, nor will the condition of the country justify, this summary and wholesale disposition of property which is neither perishable nor removable; it is ordered

First. That the further sale of unreturned lands for taxes due thereon be suspended from this date, and that assessors and collectors report the same to the Comptroller from their respective registers.

Second. That assessors and collectors use all proper diligence to close up the unfinished collections on their respective rolls, and finally settle their accounts for 1869 and previous years, with the Comptroller, by the 1st day of February, 1870, to which time the final settlement has been extended by Special Orders No. 154, current series, from this Headquarters.

Third. The taxes for 1870, State and county, shall be levied in conformity with the "Act to levy taxes," approved November 6, 1866; and all acts and military orders, authorizing the levy of special county taxes, are hereby suspended; and said taxes shall be assessed and collected in accordance with the laws in force for that purpose immediately preceding the passage of the said act of 10th November, 1866 first above recited, which is hereby suspended, except as to the settlement of accounts raised under it.

Fourth. The assessment rolls shall be made out to duplicate and re-assessment on the "last page," to the correctness of which the County Court must certify, one copy of which will be deposited with the Clerk of the County Court, and the other with the Comptroller of Public Accounts on or before the 1st day of June, 1870; and assessors and collectors will finally settle and close their accounts with the Comptroller by the 31st October thereafter, when they shall be entitled to mileage at the rate of twenty cents per mile for every mile traveled in going to and returning from the seat of government.

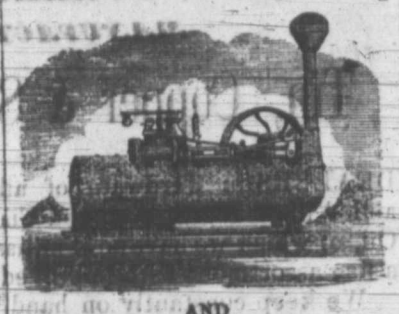

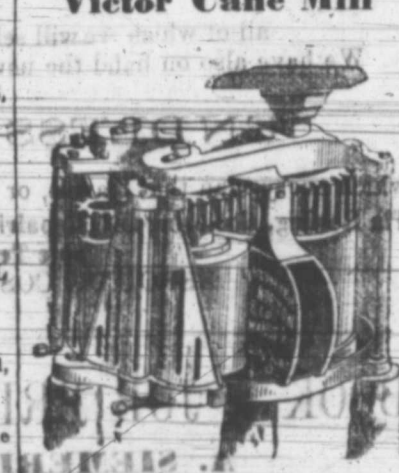

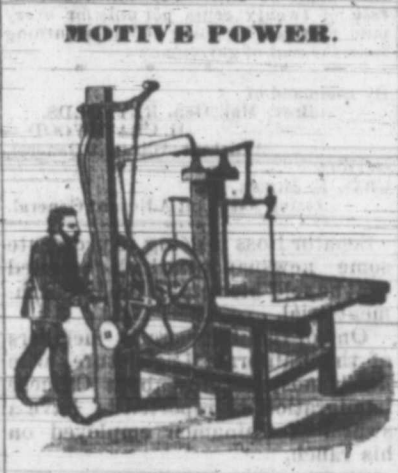
