The Rerivicks Bay and Texas taltroad Charter

The new charter recently granted by the Legislature of Louisiana to the Berwick's Bay and Texas Rail road company, printed in our paper to day, we regard, in all its features, as a model, Sec. 4 secures the benefits of the road to all classes of our citizens, without distinction, a new and valuable clause for a railroad charter, and the 5th Section secures the certain and speedy construction of the road, within a stated time,-28 months. Texas is soon to be invaded by railroads.

Policy of the New Administration.

Governor Davis has been install ed as Provisional Governor, and cannot be considered fairly in possession of all the prerogatives of the chief Executive of the State. Still his election by the people gives far greater sanction to his acts than enjoyed by his predecessor, and the people look upon him as the Governor of the State, and not the subordinate of the military Commander. Having assumed the office, the next thing looked for is his policy. The rule having been heretofore, that the successful candidate, the moment he landed in his official position, became a different individual to what he was during the political canvass-striking out immediately to make sure his re-election, by drawing to his support his political enemies by acts of conciliation—it is taken for granted that Governor Davis will follow suite. In this, the professional politicians are sadly mistaken. Governor Davis has no new policy to develop. His policy is the same as set forth by the Republican party during the canvass, and is embraced in the determination to establish a thoroughly loyal State government; to secure the political rights of all men; to carry out in their proper spirit the liberal provisions of the new constitution; to build up proper tribunals of justice, giving protection to the life and property of every person within the State, in short, to make Texas a Republican State. 


