In Berlin you can have a cab for twenty minutes for twelve cents, and for half an hour for seventeen cents; and you can take your luggage with you for twelve cents additional. In Paris you have a good vehicle, with two seats, for forty-five cents an hour by day, and sixty cents at night, with a few cents extra charge for baggage, and about ten per cent. less if you take the vihicle in the public street, instead of ordering it at the stable. In Switzerland you can have a man and horse, or mule, a day for two dollars or two and a half, even in places where travellers are numer ous; and in Germany seventy cents, or a German dollar, is though fair pay for an intelligent guide in the city or country.
