General Market Report. Business a little reviving, and the arrivals of a few merchants from the country contributed no little to the activity generally prevailing last week.

Hides—Arrived some 7,000 or 8,000 more than last week. The sales for Texas exceeding probably 2,000 lbs. Prices unchanged. For Texas, 5 to 15 lbs, 13 1/2 to 25 to 28 lbs, 11 1/2

Wool—We note a bare market. Our English and Northern advices confirm the impression that the course of the staple (caused by the immense contracts for army blankets for both the Belgians and in Europe) will be healthy, and perhaps improved. The simple fact of a Prussian order for 1,500,000 army blankets to English manufacturers, and as many for France, exclusive of army woolsens, will create, it is to be hoped, a reaction. No arrivals from Mexico.

Bacon—Is still in good demand, and arrived freely during the last week. If receipts continue as large, the price is likely to go lower. We quote: Clear sides, @ 16 1/2; Shoulders, @ 15 1/2; Corn—The large quantities of corn that arrived during the last week, all was readily sold at from \$1.45 to \$1.50 per bushel, and continues in good demand.

LUMBER—Pine, very little on hand, and no new arrivals to expect before March. Cypress—1st class, @ 3 foot 2nd class, @ 3 foot 3rd class, @ 3 foot

COFFEES—No new arrivals of any consequence to report. Stock continues to decrease. Prices unchanged. Rio, ordinary, 20 1/2 gold Choice, 21 1/2

An Ordinance

Enforcing the collecting of fines and costs imposed in the Recorder's court, not otherwise provided for.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the city of San Antonio.

Section 1. That in all cases where a fine or fine and imprisonment only, are provided for by any Ordinance of the city, as a punishment for offences committed in violation of any of the city ordinances, the Recorder may order that in default of immediate payment of the fine and costs, the defendant be committed to the city prison or put to hard labor on the public works of the city, under the direction of the Police, until the fine and costs are paid, allowing one dollar per day until the sum amounts to that of the fine and costs.

Sec. 2. Should a prisoner refuse to labor when directed, by virtue of any order or judgment of the Recorder's Court, and not be excused by reason of the City Physician's certificate of disability, then the officer having him or her in charge, shall place the prisoner so refusing in solitary confinement, and feed him or her on bread and water only, until he or she may consent to work, as required, or until the fine and costs are satisfied at the rates provided for in the first section of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. Any prisoner wishing to be excused from labor under this Ordinance, shall apply to the City Physician for an examination, and he shall certify as to the fact, and if he officially certifies that the prisoner is unable to work, then he shall be excused; provided that city physicians' certificates shall not release the prisoner from confinement in the city prison, the time required to make the sum of the fine and costs, unless the City Physician shall further officially certify that the imprisonment would cause great bodily injury to, or endanger the life of the prisoner.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
