OFFICIAL LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES.

Passed at the Third Session of the Forty-First Congress. [GENERAL NATURE—No. 54.] AN ACT making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses of the government for the year ending June thirty, eighteen hundred and seventy-two. TREASURY DEPARTMENT. (Continued) Office of assistant treasurer at Charleston, South Carolina...

For checks and certificates of deposit for office of assistant treasurer at New York, and other officers, eight thousand dollars. For additional clerks under the act for the better organization of the treasury, at such rates as the Secretary of the Treasury may deem just and reasonable, ten thousand dollars.

For salaries of the Director, treasurer, assayer, melter and refiner, chief coiners and engravers, assistant assayer, and seven clerks, thirty-seven thousand nine hundred dollars. For wages of workmen and adjusters, one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars.

For incidental and contingent expenses, including postage and repairs, thirty-five thousand dollars. For specimens of ores and coins to be preserved in the cabinet of the mint, six thousand dollars.

For salaries of superintendent, treasurer, assayer, melter and refiner, coiners, and six clerks, thirty thousand five hundred dollars. For wages of workmen and adjusters, one hundred and seventy-eight thousand dollars.

For incidental and contingent expenses, repairs, and postage, fifty-nine thousand five hundred and forty-five dollars. For salary of superintendent, four thousand five hundred dollars; for salary of melter and refiner, three thousand dollars; for salary of assistant assayer, two thousand dollars; for salary of deputy treasurer, three thousand dollars; for compensation of clerk, ten thousand two hundred dollars.

For wages of workmen, sixty-eight thousand dollars. For incidental and contingent expenses, twenty-two thousand dollars. For assayer, (who shall have charge of said mint), two thousand five hundred dollars.

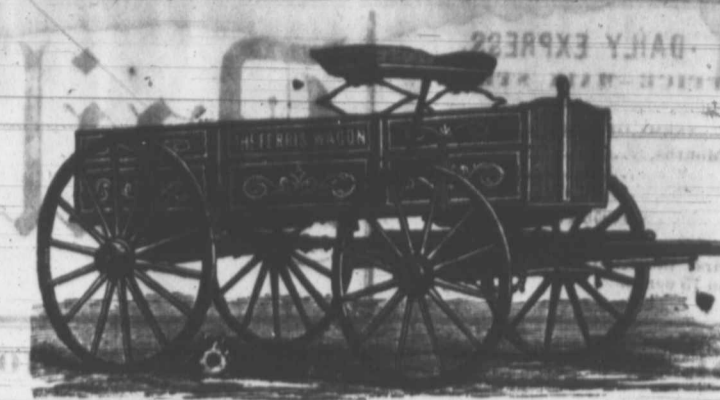

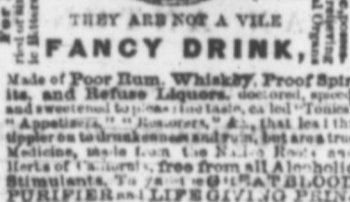
