Some six years ago I was speaking with a well known publisher of this city, who sat at his desk signing some checks that the bookkeep er had prepared for him. The signature was of the firm, and was a peculiar one, as he wrote it. I casually remarked that it was an ele-gant signature for a forger. He promptly responded that there was no forger that could sign that name so as to deceive him.

"He is standing at your elbow." "Do you mean to say," said he, "that you can imitate that signature so that I cannot detect the forgery!"



The signature was of the firm, and was a peculiar one, as he wrote it. I casually remarked that it was an ele-gant signature for a forger. He promptly responded that there was no forger that could sign that name so as to deceive him.

We are satisfied from all information that can be gathered that the hopes entertained, of a completion of the Gulf, West Texas and Pacific Railroad, has no foundation; the directors having plainly shown their intentions by the discharge of all workness on the route, mye enough of them to lay the ties and iron upon the graded portion reaching to Victoria. We can ascribe no reason for this determination of Mesers. Morean & McComb, save it is, that Victoria, as a town around which they can centre certain business interests, suits their ideas, and they intend to concentrate their influence in making it a cattle mart that can be worked in their interests.

The fact of their discontinuing any further work upon the road is shown in the refusal of Morgan to employ a construction corps, who made advantageous offers to him at New Orleans, (advantages ahead of those enjoyed heretofore in constructing the road to Victoria,) but whose propositions were met with such curt and point blank refusals that the discontinuance of work

is plainly obvious.

Fortunately the people of West Texas, who have for years been under the galling monopoly of this man Morgan, are not in this instance to suffer from his new whim and caprice, for a liberal charter has been granted to certain of our Texas people in the different West Texas counties, and the work of organizing a powerful company, meaning business in its most energetic

The privileges of the bill are in substance, the granting of the right of way to a railroad company from some point on Matagorda Bay, at or near Indianola, to San Antonio by the way of the valley of the river of the same name. From thence by the most feasible route the company is given the right of way to El l'aso, where it will unite with the Southern Pacific route, and thus the tide waters of the cast and west will be connected by the shortest possible line that can be drawn in any part of the United States. Two years is the time allewed for the completion of this road to San Antonio, otherwise the rights of charter dec. are ferfeited. It has no subsidies attached from the State, but proposes to command itself to the people, in whose interest it is built, on its own merits;

And now a word on our own behalf. When the railroad fever ran highest at the capital and a powerful lobby sought to arrest certain measures from the legislature with its money, we fought against every road but the International and the Gulf, West Texas and Pacific road, and to the latter devoted almost exclusive attention, believing the promises that Meurs. Morgan de McComb gave through their agents, so ar resting on a solid basis that a year or a year and a half would see their road run-

ning to this place. In their stoppage of the work at Victoria we consider they have forfeited all claims upon either the aid or gratitude of the people of the section between that place and here, and we know no better way for our people to show their indignation, and the enterprise that Morgan little dreams our people posses, than by lending every possible aid and ancouragement to the road which it is new preposed to beild, having the same guage as the Southern Pacific route and proving in its extension essentially the trunk road of West Texas. We learn the propositions which the directors of the new route have to offer, are most liberal, and what is more than satisfactory they

ask no risks and leave us man bound by future uncertainties, as in the case of those who donated (conditionally) monies and lands to a road represented a year or two ago by Col. Stell and others. We want West Texans to essentially interest them-selves in this pew route. Take down the map of our great State and draw its lines from Indianola to San Antonio and from thence to El Paso, and see for yourselves the advantages this road will have to all of our west, in its being the great trunk road, from which it will be but a small matter to extend lateral branches either to the right or left of its line, and thus open up the resources of every part of West Texas. We can expect nothing from Morgan's route. Already it has been reduced to a narrow guage track, thus showing his abandonment of any idea of tapping the Southern Pacific. Left in the lurch by his evident carleasness of our interests, it behooves us to rigorously assist and encourage this new route that is bound by its charter to do certain things, favorable to our entire western section, or forfeit all its rights and have its charter become a nullity.

Already the attention of capitalists has been drawn to the advantages of the road, but we hope the preponderance of stock will be taken by our own people and incorperators along its route; then there will be an independence in the matter that will secure us from any such disappointments as were deftly prepared by the Morgan faction of the Gulf, West Texas and Pacific Road.


