OFFICIAL LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES,

Passed at the Third Session of
the Forty-First Congress.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 52.]
AN ACT making appropriations for the cur-
rent and contingent expenses of the In-
dian department, and for fulfilling treaty
stipulations with various Indian tribes,
for the year ending June thirty, eighteen
hundred and seventy-two, and for other
purposes.
(Continued)

PLATHEANS AND OTHER CONFEDERATED
TRIBES.
For the third of five instalments, on one
hundred and twenty thousand dollars, be-
ing the third series, for beneficial objects,
at the discretion of the President, per
fourth article treaty sixteenth July, eight-
een hundred and fifty-five, four thousand
dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
the support of an agricultural and indus-
trial school, keeping in repair the build-
ings, and providing suitable furniture,
books, and stationery, per fifth article
treaty sixteenth July, eighteen hundred
and fifty-five, three hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
keeping in repair blacksmith's, tin and gun
smith's, carpenter's, and wagon and plow
makers' shops, and providing necessary
tools therefor, per fifth article treaty six-
teenth July, eighteen hundred and fifty-
five, five hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
the employment of two farmers, two mil-
lers, one blacksmith, one tinner, one gun-
smith, one carpenter, and one wagon and
plow maker, per fifth article treaty six-
teenth July, eighteen hundred and fifty-
five, seven thousand four hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
keeping in repair saw and flouring mills,
and for furnishing the necessary tools and
fixtures therefor, per fifth article treaty
sixteenth July, eighteen hundred and fifty-
five, five hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
keeping in repair the hospital and provid-
ing the necessary medicines and furniture
therefor, per fifth article treaty sixteenth
July, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, three
hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
pay of a physician, per fifth article treaty
sixteenth July, eighteen hundred and fifty-
five, one thousand four hundred dol-
lars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
keeping in repair the buildings required
for the various employees, and furnishing
the necessary furniture therefor, per fifth
article treaty sixteenth July, eighteen hun-
dred and fifty-five, three hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for
the pay of each of the head chiefs of the
Flatheads, Kootenay, and Upper Pend
d'Oreilles tribes, per fifth article treaty
sixteenth July, eighteen hundred and fifty-
five, one thousand five hundred dollars.

For insurance and transportation of an-
nuity goods and provisions to said Indians,
per fifth article treaty of July sixteenth,
eighteen hundred and fifty-five, two thou-
sand dollars.

For this amount, to be expended in such
goods, provisions, and other articles as the
President may from time to time deter-
mine, including insurance and transporta-
tion thereof, in instructing in agricultural
and mechanical pursuits, in providing em-
ployees, educating children, procuring
medicine and medical attendance, care for
and support of the aged, sick, and infirm,
and in any other respect to promote their
civilization, comfort, and improvement,
thirty-five thousand dollars.

For interest in lieu of investment on
fifty-seven thousand five hundred dollars,
balance of one hundred and fifty-seven
thousand five hundred dollars, to the first
of July, eighteen hundred and seventy-one,
at five per centum per annum, for educa-
tion or other beneficial purposes, under the
direction of the President, per ninth ar-
ticle of treaty of May seventeen, eighteen
hundred and fifty-four, two thousand eight
hundred and seventy-five dollars.

For interest in lieu of investment on two
hundred thousand dollars, at five per cen-
tum per annum, per second article treaty of
January fourteen, eighteen hundred and
forty-six, ten thousand dollars.

For eighteenth instalment of interest on
one hundred thousand dollars, at five per
centum per annum, for educational and
other beneficial purposes, per treaty of May
eighteen, eighteen hundred and fifty-four,
five thousand dollars.
For eighteenth instalment of interest on two
hundred thousand dollars, to be paid in eight-
teen hundred and seventy-two, per second
article treaty eighteen May, eighteen
hundred and fifty-four, five thousand dol-
lars.

For sixth of fifteen instalments, for pay
and subsistence of one superintendent of
farming, one farmer, one blacksmith, one
sawyer, one carpenter, and one wagon
and plow maker, as per fifth article treaty
of October fourteen, eighteen hundred
and sixty-four, six thousand dollars.
For sixth of twenty instalments to pay
salary and subsistence of one physician,
one miller, and two school teachers, as
per fifth article treaty of October fourteen,
eighteen hundred and sixty-four, three
thousand six hundred dollars.

MAKAI TRIBE.
For second of ten instalments of thirty
thousand dollars, (being the fifth series,)
under direction of the President, as per
fifth article of treaty of January thirty-one,
eighteen hundred and fifty-five, one thou-
sand dollars.
For twelfth of twenty instalments for
support of a smith and carpenter's shop,
and to provide the necessary tools therefor,
per eleventh article treaty thirty-first Janu-
ary, eighteen hundred and fifty-five, five
hundred dollars.

For twelfth of twenty instalments for the
support of an agricultural and industrial
school, and pay of teachers, two thousand
five hundred dollars.
For twelfth of twenty instalments for the
employment of a blacksmith, carpenter,
farmer, and physician, who shall furnish
medicine for the sick, four thousand six
hundred dollars.

MEMORANDUM.
For sixth of fifteen instalment of annuity
upon two hundred and forty two thousand
six hundred and eighty six dollars, for ces-
sation of lands, per fourth article treaty May
twelve, eighteen hundred and fifty four,
and Senate amendment thereto, sixteen
thousand one hundred and seventy nine
dollars and six cents.

MIAMI OF FLORIDA.
For permanent provision for blacksmith
and assistant, and iron and steel for shop,

erwise, per articles treaty twenty first Au-
gust, eighteen hundred and five, two hun-
dred and fifty dollars.

For permanent annuity in goods or oth-
erwise, per third and separate articles of
treaty of thirtieth September, eighteen hun-
dred and nine, three hundred and fifty dol-
lars.

MIAMI OF INDIANA.
For interest on two hundred and twenty
one thousand two hundred and fifty seven
dollars and eighty six cents uninvested, at
five per centum, per Senate amendment to
fourth article treaty fifth June, eighteen
hundred and fifty four, eleven thousand
and sixty two dollars and eighty nine cents.

MOHAWK.
For pay of teachers of manual labor
schools, for all necessary materials therefor,
and for the subsistence of the pupils, two
thousand dollars.

For this amount to be expended in such
goods, provisions, and other articles as the
President may from time to time determine,
including insurance and transportation there-
of, in instructing in agricultural and mechani-
cal pursuits, in providing employees, edu-
cating children, procuring medicine and
medical attendance, care for and support of
the aged, sick, and infirm, and in any other
respect to promote their civilization, com-
fort and improvement, twenty five thou-
sand dollars.

For third of ten instalments of such arti-
cles of clothing, or raw material, in lieu
thereof, for eight thousand Navajo Indi-
ans, not exceeding five dollars per Indian,
as per eighth article of treaty of June one,
eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, forty
thousand dollars.

For last of three instalments for seeds,
and agricultural implements for fourteen
hundred families, at the rate of twenty five
dollars per family, as per seventh article
same treaty, thirty five hundred dollars.
For second of ten instalments to be used
by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs in
the purchase of such articles as from time
to time the condition and necessities of the
Indians may indicate to be proper, the sum
of ten dollars to each person who engages
in farming or mechanical pursuits, (one
thousand four hundred families,) as per
eighth article of the same treaty, fourteen
thousand dollars.

For pay of two teachers, two thousand
dollars.
For insurance and transportation of goods,
fifteen thousand dollars.

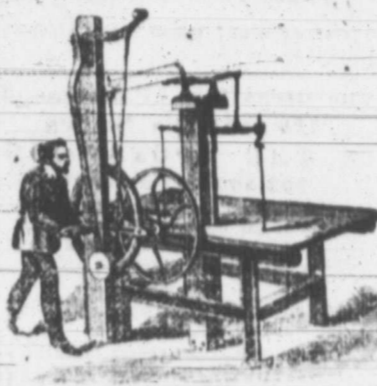

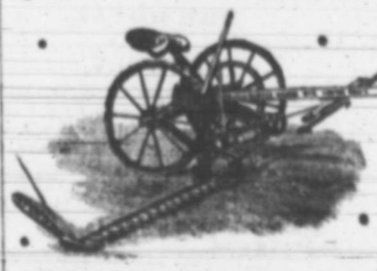

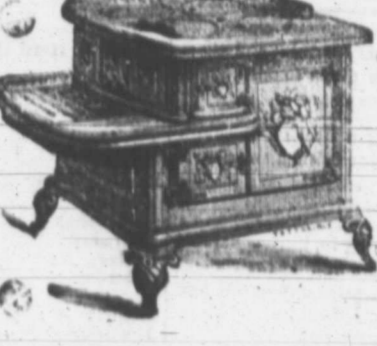
