The Storm at Galveston.

We received the Galveston News of the 4th, 6th and 7th yesterday, containing full accounts of the storm that visited them with its fury a day or two ago. The accounts as given in our telegrams of yesterday cover nearly the whole case, the damage being really much less than first reported from Houston. .The Galvestonians call the storm the "harmless storm," as the lamage was slight.

The bark Virginia Dare, 802 tons burthen, was wrecked and fourteen of her crew saved by the heroic exertions of Capt. Irvine, James McCaffrey, James Johnson, Syl, Harrington, Charles Charles and Wills liam Martin. The Morgan steamer Whitney took the pilot boat "Eclipse" in tow and ventured as near the wreck as possible while a fine life boat, belonging to the bark. Bridgeport, was also carried and on nearing the wreck lanuched, and the brave fellows above named made two trips to the wreck and 'brought off the fourteen benumbed and half drowned seamen of the Virginia Dare.

All Galveston greeted the return of the gallant feliows with a perfect oyation. Charley Forbes was the incepter of the movement resulting in the saving of valuable lives.

Fences and onthonses in the city suffered considerably as did also the Houston railway. The depot was unharmed. Thirty feet of the embankment on either end of the bridge was washed away, but large gange of men are at work repairing the damage. The rain fall during 48 hours was 6.01 inches. The highest volocity of the wind reached; was 39 miles per hour. A few houses in the flats were washed away as also an oyster shed or two. No lives lost as far as can be antheutically learhed.

Experimental Democracy.

In the last outburst of political wisdom (so called,) Democracy has shown the first spark of returning consciousness. Drifting back into the history of the past, Vallandigham has discovered some of the cast off clothing of the republicans, and with a bray (intended, however, to be considered a lion's roar) lie jumps wildly into the political arena, but seems to affright his own political associates more than he does the republicans of the country.

Vallandigham's attempt to assume for the party a virtue it-does not possess, is only another of those peculiar experiments which hinge to democratic action in the past ten years. Like all the rest, it will be void of all success and only serve to widen the breach between the extremists and conservatives of the Demogratic party. Already the Southern Democracy are bit terly denouncing the action of Vallandig ham. Their cherished opposition to the amendments, they deem a vital necessity of the success of the party. Factions, oppressive and proscriptive, they have not learned to give way to moderate comosels or fixed rtue in aught save that same oid style of so-called chivalry that naturally arrays of sm in hostility to anything North of Mason & Dixon's line.


