CHAP. CXI.—An Act relating to Records of the Courts of the United States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America Congress in assembled. That whenever the record of any judgment, or decree, or other proceeding of any judicial court of the United States shall have been court of the United States shall have been or shall hereafter be just or dastroyed, any party or person interested therein may, on application to such court, and on showing to the satisfaction of such court that the same has been lost or destroyed without fault or neglect of the party or person making such application, obtain an order from auch court authorizing such defect to be supplied by a duly certified copy of such original record, where the same can be obtained, which certified copy shall thereafter have the same effect as such original record would have lead in all respects.
