The United States of America and the Austro-Hungarian Menarchy. RIGHTS, ETC., OF CONSULS.

Signed July 11, 1870; ratified December 19, 1870; ratifications exchanged June 26, 1871; proclaimed June 29, 1871. By the President of the United States

A PROCLAMATION, (Continued.) ARTICLE XI.

Consula, vice consular agents, shall have exclusive charge of the intermation. They shall have therefore the exclusive power to take cognizance of and te settle all differences which may arise at sea or in port between captains, officers, and execution of mutual contracts, subject in each case to the laws of their own nation.

The local authorities shall in no way interfere, exception in cases where the differences on board ship are of a nature to disturb peace and public order is port ag on shore, or when persons other than the efficers and crew of the vessel are parties to the disturbance; except as afersasid the local authorities shall confine themselves to the rendering of forcible assistance if required by the consula vice-consuls, or consular agents, and shall cause the arrest, temporary imprisonment, and removal on board his own vessel, of every yerson whose hame is found on the musterrolls or register of the ship or list of the oreal.

Consula general, consula, vice censula, or onsular agents, shall have the power to cause the arrest of all sailers or all other persons belonging to the crews of vessels of their nation who may be guilty of having deserted on the respective territories of the high contracting powers, and to have them sent on board or back to their native country.

To that end they shall make a written

To that end they shall make a written opplication to the competent local authority, supporting it by the exhibition of the ship's degister and list of the crew, or else, should the vessel have salled previously, by praducing an authoritisted copy of these doenments, showing that the persons claimed really de beiong to the ship's crew.

Upon such request the surrender of the deserter shall not be refused. Every aid and assistance shall, moreover, be granted to the said consular authorities for the detection and arrest of deserters, and the latter shall be taken to the prisons of the denuity and there detained at the request and expense of the consular authority until they may be an epportunity for sanding them away.

The duration of this imprisonment shall not exceed the term of three menths, at the expiration of which time, and upon three days' notice to the consul, the prisoner shall be sat free, and he shall not be liable to rearrest for the same cause.

Should, however, the deserter have committed on shore an indictable offence, the local authorities shall be free to postpone his extradition until due sentence shall have been passed and executed.

The high contracting parties agree that seamen, or other individuals forming part of the ships' crew, who are efficient ook place, shall not be affected by the provisions of this srticle.


