TELEGRAPHIC
VIMARINA, Aug. 10.—Court martial es-
tablished Rogues and Mayor Puteux to ven-
al servitude for life. Official prosecution
said the Mayor's moderate language en-
titled him to some favor. President's com-
pliment of comments of the press upon their
cases.
A motion for the prolongation of three
years of the office of Thiers as chief of the
executive power will probably be intro-
duced in the Assembly to-morrow. Pre-
vision is made for the resignation of Thiers
in case of dissolution of the Assembly be-
fore the expiration of his term of office.
Advice from Algeria reports continued
improvement in the situation of affairs,
and say, the insurgents are rapidly sub-
mitting to the authority of the Govern-
ment.
In the House of Commons to-day Glad-
stone announced the postponement of the
Queen's departure for Balmoral, in defer-
ence to the condition of public business.
The date of reorganization of Parliament
was, therefore, uncertain.
Messrs. Postmaster General, announced
the reduction of telegraph tolls to 6 pence
for ten words throughout the United
Kingdom would be made upon the occa-
sion of a new general office.
Cardwell, Secretary of War, spoke in de-
ference of the English military, compared
with that of Prussia. The latter was not
suited to a free country like England. He
also stated that the military movement to
take place at Berkshire the coming autumn
promised excellent results.
In the House of Lords, the Marquis of
Ryan made a speech in favor of the ballot,
in the course of which he referred to his
experience in the United States in the
most pleasant terms, and paid compliment
to American institutions.
SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 9.—The Lake Tahoe
and Central Pacific railroad tunnel will be
five miles long, through granite, and 16 ft.
in height by 8 feet wide.
NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 10.—Warmth wing
of the Republican Convention met at
Turner's Hall to-day. One hundred and
eight delegates answered at roll call.
Congressional Committee was announced,
and is the same as last year.
Committee reported resolutions endors-
ing the administration of Gov. Warmoth
for his faithful execution of constitutional
provisions for public education of children
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appropriations to individual enter-
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its expenses; denouncing acts of the Custom
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
