KILLING OF JOHN MCCARTHY.—The Washington Substitute and Broker—Lobbyist, Gambler &c.

The Washington Chronicle of the 15th instant contains an account of the shooting and killing of the notorious John McCarthy who of late years had achieved an appreciable notoriety at the National Capitol in various disreputable ways and pursuits. Among the latter being those of substitute and lobbyist, gambler and broker. The killing was done on Pennsylvania Avenue by another gambler named Darden, and the cause seems to be traced to an old feud.

But for the disreputable notoriety gained by this person, figuring conspicuously for years, at short intervals in the public

points, his death might scarcely deserve mention; but the fact of his silent taking of his will to rest is—because he was to Washington what John Morley is to New York, Haggerty was to Philadelphia and other kindred spirits and has been to other large cities. Perhaps, though, McCarthy would figure under the head of a milder grade of ruffianism.

NEW persons visiting Washington of late years—and remaining long enough to look about them,—but have either seen or heard of John McCarthy. He was not classed as a dangerous man but rather assumed the role of a sporting gentleman. In appearance he was rather an impressive person and by many admitted to be very handsome. In stature he was above the medium height with a well knit frame and figure. His attire was always of the neatest and fashionable kind, which, with features of an aquiline cast, jet black curling hair and heavy black mustache made up a person of unusual attractiveness.
