Platform and Resolutions of the New Brunswick Convention. Whereas, It is customary for political parties to announce their platform upon the opening of a political campaign, and particularly is this appropriate when the people are agitated upon issues both national and local in their character. Therefore be it

Resolved, That the Republicans of the 4th Congressional District in Texas, in Convention assembled, recognize the Republican party as the party of progress and civilization, and we pledge ourselves, as we have done in the past so in the future, to protect the rights and liberties of the people without regard to race or color.

Resolved, That we emphatically instruct our representatives to use all their power and influence for the protection by law of our frontier against the depredations of the savage Indians, and that we deem it the imperative duty of the national government to reorganize the State of Texas for all the expenses incurred on account of frontier protection.

Resolved, That thirty years of Democratic misrule, including the destruction caused by the rebellion, has left our State and local government in dilapidation and ruin, making it necessary now to call upon the people to bear a heavy tax in order to establish a sound and permanent system of taxation, and to repair public buildings, and open and repair public highways, but as soon as the nation has secured to build the necessary normal schools, and put the local government in proper running order, we favor a reduction of taxation; pledging ourselves to this policy and against the increase of taxation, by the granting of railroad subsidies, etc.

Resolved, That the Democratic State Convention refusing to accept the natural and legitimate fruits of the late rebellion, by formally declaring in their platform their purpose to restore the government to its original condition, and obliterate the laws of the United States in defense of liberty, to expunge the thirteenth, fourteenth and fifteenth amendments to the Constitution from that instrument and reconstitute the colored man to the virtual condition of a slave, calls for earnest condemnation at our hands.

Resolved, That we hereby declare it to be the determination of this Convention to entertain the name of no man as a candidate for Congress who does not give his unqualified support to the party nominees and the platform herein set forth.

einen Feuerball, da er der Meinung war, daß
man die Ursachen dieser unvorhergesehenen

denweiches Baumwollengewebe genommen
und mit gelochtem Leinwand beschichtet. Dann

Baumwolllappen mittig dazwischen. Die
Röhre stellte man unter den Draum eines
Waarenlagers hinter einer Spindel, legte
eine Zinkplatte unter und eine Zinnplatte
oben auf die Röhre und überließ das Ganze
sich selbst.
Der Raum unter dem Dach war luftig
und der Wetter sehr heiß, aber nach acht Tagen
machte sich ein durchdringender „Brandgeruch“
bemerklich und als man die Röhre öffnete,
sah man den Baumwolllappen sichtlich verkohlt
und der übrige Inhalt der Röhre sah aus,
als ob er einem glühenden Ofen zu nahe
gekommen wäre.
Später, als die Sonnenstrahlen bereits
eine höhere Temperatur erzeugten, wurden
zwei Kisten mit der Röhre besetzt, die
einer mit Wasser und der andere mit Öl
bedeckt waren mit einigen feinen Holzspähnen
zusammengewickelt und unter dem Dach-
raum nahe an die Röhre gelegt. Als eine
Woche verging, wurde ein Arbeiter in einem
anstoßenden Zimmer durch „Brandgeruch“
erschreckt und als man nachsah, fand man
die Röhre bereits verbrannt und sie war
so heiß, daß man sie nicht ganz berühren
konnte. In einem mit Wasser gefüllten Eimer
wurde sie abgeworfen, um das Feuer zu
löschen. Während des heißen Wetters im Monat
Juli, wurde eine gleiche Röhre mit Öl und
mit Öl oder Harz beschmierter Lumpen
mit zwei Streichhölzchen zusammen in eine
Blase gelegt und so an einen Haken,
durch welche die Rauchabfuhrfontaine ein-
dringen konnte, aufgehängt. Am dritten Tage
nachdem die Röhre mit Öl beschichtet und
mit Öl beschmierter Lumpen zusammen in eine
Blase gelegt, als der Deckel der
Blase abgenommen wurde.
Zuletzt wurde ein Koffer mit dem Inhalt
eines Lumpenfasses gefüllt und ein mit
Benzin beschmierter Lumpen dazu be-
gelegt. Der wohlverschlossene Koffer
setzte man in eine Ecke eines feineren
Abzuges, wo keine Gefahr eines Ausbruchs
vorhanden war. Bald darnach, als die In-
haltsstoffe des Koffers bereits von einem
Feuer befeuert wurden, fand man sie an dem
Platz, wo der Koffer aufgehängt wurde,
als ob er einen schwarzen Rauch und die Stein-
wand vor sich gehabt hätte.
Dieses letzte Experiment zeigt namentlich
sehr deutlich die unvorhergesehenen Entzündungs-
ursachen mancher z. B. unklarer Feuer-
ereignisse. Benzin, zum Reinigen von
Metallen u. dgl. und mancher in diesem
Zweck benutzte mit Benzin getränkte Lumpen
sind gewöhnlich irgend eine Röhre, die Lumpen,
Papier und andere brennbare Stoffe
enthält, geworfen, ohne daß man weiter
darüber achtet. Alle solche und andere
Lumpen, welche dazu gebraucht werden, um Öl,
Benzin, Terpentin u. dgl. abzuwischen,
sollten vorsichtig so aufgehängt werden —
z. B. in metallenen, oder feineren Ge-
häßen — daß kein Feuer dadurch entstehen
kann. Wie leicht dies letztere geschehen mag,
das ist durch die oben beschriebenen Experi-

TEA CULTURE.
SAN ANTONIO, Aug. 22 '71.
To Dr. Wm. G. Kingsbury and Col. Thos. G. Williams, Committee of the Western Texas Agricultural Association.
GENTLEMEN:
I have the pleasure of acknowledging the receipt of your esteemed favor of 5th inst., requesting me to give your association some account of the nature of the tea plant—its cultivation and the manner of manufacturing the leaf into the tea of commerce, and I have the honor to submit to you a full account, to the best of my abilities, and will endeavor to answer all the questions propounded in your letter, to do which I shall commence with

SEED.
The tea plant commences to give seed in its third and fourth year—flowering in September or October of one year, and the seed ripening at the same time the following year. The seed is very oleaginous—about the size of a hazel nut—will weigh from 200 to 300 to the pound. The seed is contained in a capsule, (which sometimes contains as many as four seeds) and should be shelled as soon as dry, and the seed planted either in nurseries or at the stake as soon as possible in a manner to be described hereafter. I would here remark that I am speaking altogether at present of the cultivation as practiced in India, and will afterwards refer to its cultivation in this country.

NURSERIES.
Should be ready for the seed, and should be prepared in a very careful manner—plough or hoe very deep, making the earth as fine as for a flower garden, and lay off in beds of convenient length, and

about 6 to 8 feet wide—the ground should be selected according to the climate. If the climate be a very hot one, a low shady place near the water should be selected, in order that the young plants should be sheltered from the hot sun and watered if necessary; if a cold climate a warm sunny spot should be chosen: although it is not absolutely necessary either to shade, or water even in the hottest climate, yet I have found by experience that shade and water will force the plant into a more healthy and vigorous state, and cause it to stand the transplanting better and make a considerable difference in the yield in the third and fourth year. Your nursery being ready, plant your seeds about 1 1/2 inches deep in rows, say 6 to 8 inches apart, and two inches from each other. In about ten days the seed will come up, and you have nothing then to do except keep the weeds down. In very cold countries where there is frost and snow, the seed is not planted in the fall, but kept until the early spring, and then either planted at the stake or in nurseries, but the seed deteriorate very much after being kept several months and takes a much longer time to germinate, sometimes remaining in the ground for a whole year.

The tea plant delights in a light, rich loamy soil, through which the water can easily percolate, but cannot bear a cold, sour, swampy soil, nor will it thrive in such a soil—the tea will become woody and the leaves turn yellow and remain in that condition for years, but they will not die, and will recover if removed to some congenial soil. In India it never rains between May and June, except perhaps an occasional shower in April or May, and it is during the cold weather, as it is called, that all the land is prepared.

Having selected your land, plow or hoe as deeply as possible, and clean thoroughly the same, as for corn or cotton. As in the future a great deal depends upon the looks of the garden, and as it is almost impossible to run a straight line by the eye when transplanting, we adopted the method of "staking" the land prior to transplanting, this not only shows the position of the plant when weeding and saves it from being cut up by the hoe or plow, but enables you to transplant more quickly when the time comes, and it is necessary to get them in as early in the season as possible. Having staked off your land six feet by three feet, you have nothing further to do until the rains commence early in June. The object in planting six by three is that when the plants get old each alternate plant can be cut down to the ground, leaving your plants then six by six, and having fresh trees constantly coming into bearing, but I have never yet seen a garden that was old enough for this process, altho' I have seen gardens twenty years old.

As soon as there is any prospect of a continuous rain, transplanting commences. When the area is small, and a large force engaged, it is much better and far more preferable that a hole be dug near each stake and the young plant carefully put in; but when we had two or three thousand acres to put in, we found this impossible to do, and were obliged to resort to the dibble, and even with that instrument, let me tell you gentlemen, that it is no joke to put in even 1000 acres. In planting with the dibble, the same process is gone through with us planting cabbage, with which you are all familiar. A gang of men are stationed at the nursery to take up the plants carefully, another gang carry them in baskets to the third gang, who are transplanting. Much care must be taken that the young plants be carefully taken up, so that neither taps nor lateral root is broken, and equal care in putting them in their new home. It is decidedly more preferable to plant the seed direct at the stake, saving time and money; but that would depend upon the climate and your quantity of seed, as two to four seed must be planted at each stake to ensure propagation, but that certain all must be removed save one, the surplus can be used to fill up vacancies or plant new land. In this country I should try both plans, as experience only will show which is the best. After transplanting, a constant supervision must be had that there are no vacancies, for in

spite of all your care, some plants will be put in carelessly and die, and nothing spoils the looks of a four year old garden so much as vacancies or trees of an uneven size. This being attended to, you have nothing to do until the third year, except keep your garden clean and prepare for

MANUFACTURING.
For which purpose you will want three houses, and I will describe the old way of manufacturing by hand, and point out the improvements of machinery, etc., afterwards: House No. 1 is generally an open building, small sides, and large enough to give plenty of room, and must be furnished with several large tables, enough for the quantity you expect to manufacture. A set of scales and a chulah or oven, which is an iron pan set at an angle of about 25°, breast high, in masonry work, a fire place underneath. The pan being breast high, sufficient to heat the iron almost to a red heat.
House No. 2 must contain a number of broad shelves all around the sides, raised one above the other, say two feet apart, also rows of holes, dug say 6 feet apart and 1 foot in diameter, a lot of willow zinc or tin vessels 4 feet high and of the shape of a double truncated cone, the two small ends joined together, with sufficient space to let the heat pass through, made, I believe in this shape to create draught, a lot of flat willow ware trays of different sizes, and a lot of charcoal.
House No. 3 is the assorting and packing house.

PRUNING.
When your trees are large enough to bear plucking, their pruning must be attended to as soon as the cold weather sets in and the sap goes down. There is no doubt it would be better if this was done on scientific principles, but whilst it is easy to do that with a few thousand, it is rather difficult with millions of plants. So each laborer was provided with a pair of garden shears and a stick 2 1/2 feet long, and placing this in the center of the bush, makes a clean lateral cut of all above shears height. This being done in cold weather, we await the first frost of leaf in the spring to commence.

When your trees are large enough to bear plucking, their pruning must be attended to as soon as the cold weather sets in and the sap goes down. This being done in cold weather, we await the first frost of leaf in the spring to commence.

This season commences about the middle of March and continues until the first of November, the best tea being made in the early spring. A "flush" of young tender leaves comes out fresh about every ten days, so that it is necessary to have your labor so arranged that they will go around the whole garden every ten days in order that the tea house should always be kept in full operation. The plucking is done by women and children, each carrying a basket in which to put the leaves as gathered, the operation is a very simple one, consisting only of nipping off with the thumb and forefinger the first three or four upper fresh succulent leaves. The pay is controlled by the number of pounds each pick, and the common task is 32 lbs. to each person, double that quantity can easily be plucked by an active woman; 4 pounds of green leaf will produce 1 pound of manufactured tea. The leaf being plucked, it is brought in the evening to house No. 1, where, after being weighed, it is spread in their layers on flat baskets which are placed on the shelves in house No. 2, and left to cool until morning. In the morning these baskets are brought out as fast as required and placed, for a few minutes, say 10 to 20, to either, or become "lump" so as easily to roll without breaking. Should there be no sun, the leaves are placed (still in the basket) over the "chulah" in No. 1.
