I would respectfully state, as suggested by General Sherman, during his recent visit to the Texas frontier, that the most direct method of meeting the question seems to be for the Legislature to pass a law making lands occupied by the United States, for military purposes on the frontier liable to condenimation in the same manner as lands required for railroad purposes.
