#### Senator Flanagan.

Our distinguished United States Senator, Mr.Flanagan, whose arrival at Austin we mentioned the other day, in response to a seronade, spoke from the balcony of the Raymond House on Thursday last. He re fered to the school bill, and other acts of the Legislature, and gave them his unqualified endorsement, sustaining Governo Davis in his administration, and proclaim ing himself in full accord and barmony with the party in the State. Unlike his colleague, Morgan Hamilton, he has always given his support to the party which elected him to his high office, and in his speech only reiterates his position.

In reference to the taxes he stated "I am aware that they are heavy and burdensome, yet the great and good work justifies the outlay and consoles us for the sacrifices." At the time when the lawless proceedings were at the highest pitch. and the excited mob was gathering from all quarters, threatening to massacre union men and colored people, Tomlinson published an "extra," a copy which we have seen, declaring that the "war of races" He even threatened the application of lynch law to Judge Oliver himself, and throughout the whole of its length his article was incendiary in the highest degree; calculated, and no doubt designed, to act as a fire-brand on the combustible material of which the mob was composed. The effect of such an article could not fail to produce the most intense excitement on men mad with hate, and only waiting for an opportunity to re-enact the scenes of bloodshed prevalent just after the secossion of the State. The fact that the "extra" was sent from Groesbeck to the surrounding country, by couriers, to exits incondiary character.

Mitrailleuses on a new system, invented Mitrallieuses on a new system, invented by General Gorloff, have been distributed for experimental practice to several infan-try regiments in Polaud. The pieces are drawn by three or four horses, the accom-panying ammunition wagon requiring one herse less.
