MEXICO.

The latest intelligence we receive from this unhappy country reports revolution in full blast, and the disorders of the electoral campaign have got increased, since the re-election of Juarez. Many of his enemies declare, that he over his new base of power to foment, corruption and violence. There is too much in Juarez's character to authorize suspicions of this nature. The only Justice he has never been over scrupulous in the selection of means to accomplish his purpose. But even Juarez was honestly elected, but that fact would not deter his opponents from pronouncing against him. Was God's highway robbery are almost the same thing in Mexico, and they have become chronic in that unfortunate country.

The longest delay, little better than the last elements in their train, have predicted for many years a system of plan and extirpation, which has become to them a regular state, a sort of second nature. Little they care for the cause for which they contend, power and revenge, and violence mischievous are their objects. Corridos, Cantos and others are well known in Western Texas as little better than bandits and ruffians. The interior of Mexico is devastated by these hordes as much as the frontier. The leaders change sides without compunction, whence the opposite party offers greater advantages.

The present situation, however, and circumstances safer, and the laboring classes, steeped in poverty, ignorance and filth, will be other causes of hastening their miserable condition, than by joining one of these bands.

That country with all its natural advantages and resources, has never been able to achieve prosperity. The different governments have never been able to protect life and property, encourage immigration or develop the different industries. The national revenues have been recklessly expended and wasted.

Yet Mexico, well governed, has an excellent climate. We wish clearly defined portions added to the United States, particularly Texas and California, who since the moment of separation have progressed with undivided responsibility. We doubt whether Mexico, left to herself, is capable of regeneration. The prominent men, Juarez, Texas, Diaz, Moreno and others have never proved equal to the task. The population is largely composed of Indians and a mixture of those with the latter race, deteriorated by climate and associations.

The average Mexican of the lower class is hardly susceptible of improvement. Immigration would have the same effect as in the United States. The aborigines would decrease in number and their extinction rapidly accomplished.

The intervention of the United States would be indispensable to change the face of affairs in Mexico. The population of Mexico only amounts to 7-8 millions, distributed over an immense territory, and with no present chance of increase. American statesmen have often objected, that the taking possession of Mexico would be a serious loss of money, especially during the present condition of one treasury, as well as the employment for a long time of a large standing army, necessary for the collection of the slender assets brigandage and guerrilla warfare, now the order of the day there. They are undoubtedly correct, but the time will come when our interests will impetuously demand action in that direction.

The future will show, or the Northwest march of the Anglo-Saxons or the past has shown on the Westward march; The Anglo-Saxons, not the Latin race are the Americans of the future. Their empire will extend over this whole continent.

ARTICLE XIII.

1. Neither slavery nor involuntary ser-
vitude, except as a punishment for crime,
wherever the party shall have been duly con-
victed, shall be allowed in the United States;
and Congress shall have the exclusive power
of legislation in all cases of such servitude,
whether such be in the jurisdiction of
Congress or of any State, or in the territory
