Policy of the Administration.

arouse the indignation of all Europe,

and to render her a constant object of

contumacious and malignant hostility.

Newspaper Laws.

We would call the special attention of

Postmasters to the following laws, to the following, in synopses of the newspaper laws:

1. A Postmaster is required to give notice by letter (returning a power does not answer the law) of his intention to do not take his position of "non-interference" and state the reason for it, not being taken; and a copy of the same to do so, and to do so, responsible to the publisher for the payment made.

2. Any person who takes a paper from the Postoffice, whether directed to his name or another, or whether he has submitted or not, is liable to a fine of \$100.

If a person takes a paper discontinued, he must pay all arrangements to the publisher which may continue to send it until the payment is made.

3. If the subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the publisher fails to do so, he is liable to a fine of \$100, to be paid to the Postmaster.
