Newspaper Laws.

We would call the attention of Postmasters and subscribers to the following synopsis of the newspaper laws:

A Postmaster is required to give notice of a letter (certainly a paper does not answer the law) when a subscriber does not receive his paper from the office, and stamp it with a postmark.

If a particular paper disappears, he must pay all arrears and the publisher may continue to sue it until the paper is found.

If another paper orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time, and the publisher continues to send it, the subscriber is bound to pay for it if it is free.

The law provides upon the ground that a man must pay for what he uses.

The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers and periodicals from the Postoffice, or removing and leaving them unsent, is prima facie evidence of intent to defraud.
