REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION.

CHANGES OF THEIR ORDER.

A Delegate Convention of the Republican party of Texas is hereby called to assemble in the city of Houston on the second Tuesday of May, 1873, for the purpose of amending the National Platform, and selecting delegates to the National Convention, for a thorough reorganization of the party, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the body.

SUNDAY POLITICS.

The political atmosphere of San Antonio just now, is a curious study. Not since the exciting times of 1860 and '61 have the masses of the people taken so much interest in political affairs. Those who have not attended a political meeting for fifteen years, are now anxious to be present at every meeting, in order that they may see what is going on. Everywhere is heard discussions political, always earnest, sometimes heated, and curiously enough the democracy, although they are holding no meetings, appear to take more interest in the Republican meetings than they have in their own for many years. What does this mean? With many of the bourgeois of that party, as one of the most prominent among them in our city, recently expressed himself, it is a "hope to see a sort of kitchen out fight" that will open the way for a democratic triumph. Other democrats, more patriotic, and only desirous for good government, are more than half inclined to believe that there is more prosperity and safety promised in the triumph of republican principles, than in that of those advocated by the bourgeois. Among republicans there is also an apparent diversity of opinions and equal heat in their controversy. We said equal heat—we should have said equal vindictiveness. This vindictiveness grows out of the improper and unnatural manner in which some men who have set themselves as leaders, have attempted to propagate what they call republicanism, which means chiefly, keeping themselves in power. The party, as a party, are only to a very small degree responsible for the state of things these men have brought upon us. There grates always a large number of men to the element supposed to possess the greater strength.

Just now the strength of the different political elements is, among the masses at least, in universal doubt. Consequently there is a feeling to and fro, a hesitation, and a weakness which would appear marvellous to any one who did not know the cause. Everything seems chaotic to the stranger. But is it so? Is it a struggle of unreasoning mobs for supremacy? or is there not some better, higher principle, underlying this jostling and jarring of forces? Unquestionably there is a higher principle which influences even the meanest citizen—just as electricity pervades the whole atmosphere during a severe storm of lightning, wind and rain, so mass can escape its influence, there is no man who is not more or less charged with the subtle fluid. The laws which govern political convulsions, are precisely the same as those which govern religious revivals, as they are called, or as those which govern the physical world, in their seemingly wild and lawless commotions. There is still the law, whether it be known and understood or not; and that law will govern in the end.

What is the law? It is the law of right and justice. It is not on prisons; it is not dependent upon the whims and caprices, the ignorance or prejudices, the will or irresolution of any one man, or any set of men; it is a law as forcible, as certain in its eventual results, as any one you will observe in nature. The right is sure to win in the end. Now apply this principle—or as I would call it, the present condition of our political affairs. Let every man say aside his prejudices and bigotry, and calmly deliberate upon the political issues at work. Wherein lies the heaven which will eventually leave the whole lump? Is it in the Bourbon democracy who have learned nothing by the boresome convulsions of a civil war, waged to defeat their unnatural aims. Is it in the Cincinnati Conventionists whose only announced principle is the defeat of Gen. Grant? Is it in the Austin clique who parade our State, assuming a disinterestedness of themselves, and all their past deeds, and their continuance in power? Or is it in the great National Republican party, which has never lost sight of the

underlying principles, which have made its governmental control a triumphant success during so many years? There is room for reflection here, not wholly inappropriate for Sunday, although we confess that the busy hour we have given to the subject is anything but satisfactory or complete.
