The Timuze, through trusted correspondents stationed at all points in Europe where great movements are in progress or imminent, aims to present a complete and instructive panorama of events on that continent, and to mirror the prolonged struggle between middle-sage Feudalsm and Ecclesiastician on the one hand and Niueteenth-Century skepticism and agendarism on the other. Recognizing a Divine Providence in all that proceeds and is, it looks hopefully on the great conflict as destined (like our own recent convulsion) to evolve from strife, dianster, and seeming choos, a fairer and happier future for the toiling masses of makind.


