The extensive spreading of the hu man race implies its existense from a date long enterior to the great glacial epoch, which cannot have been less than 250,000 years ago— Lyell thinks a million years ago when it is certainly known that men inhabited Europe and North America. Human bones and im-plements lately discovered are claimed as belonging to the Miocene epoch, and there is a growing disposition among primontologists to place the origin of man as far back as this, though the demonstra-tion of this date cannot yet be regarded as conclusive. The minigarded as conclusive. The minimum antiquity assignable for the Miocene is 5,000,000 years. Since the period during which man has possessed sufficient intelligence to leave a traditional record of him self is but a minute fraction of the period during which he has existed upon the earth, it is but fair to conclude that during these long ages, of which none but a geologic record remains, he has slowly acquired that superior intelligence which now so widely distinguishes him from other animals, Throughout an enormous period of time his brain structure and its correlated intellectual and emotional functions must have been constantly modified by adaptation and by natural selec-tion, while his outward physical ap-pearance has undergone few modiscations, and of these the most striking are consequent upon the cerebral changes. The most re-markable point of difference be-tween civilized and uncivilized man, as well as between man and the Chimpauzee, are the difference in size of the jaws and the inclina tion of the forehead. The latter difference is directly consequent upon increased intelligence, and

Terra del Fuego. As we on the shore were about ready to come off, we were visited by a party of wild Fuegians, five men, four women, and nine child-ren, with three dogs. They came in an English-built boat, stolen or lost from some English ship. The men and dogs landed and came to ward us with great frankness of manner. They could talk neither English nor Spanish, except the iew words, boat, fire, galleto, arco. But they understood the imperial manner of one of our officers, who said quietly, but firmly "Keep back those dogs," and immediately drove back the barking curs with sticks and stones. They warmed them selves at our fire, and seemed dis posed to be very civil and friendly. We gave them our remaining bis-quit, and what little tobacco there was in our party to spare. One of them accepted a pinch of snuff and pretended to miceze, crying "Hat-chee?" with mock solemnity. An o'd man sat down on a stone and sang to us a low, sweet recitative, or chant, in a wild key, or mode, ending on a rising melody with each stanza.
