By the Covernor of the State of Texas TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESents shall come :

WHEREAS, By a joint resolution of the Tweifth Legislature of the State of Texas, passed May 17th, 1871, it was resolved, what section six, article ten of the constitution of the State of Texas be so amended as hereafter to read and be as follows SEC. 6. The Legislature shall not hereaf ter grant lands, except for purposes of inter grant lands, except for purposes of in-ternal improvement, to any person or per-sons, nor sitall any certificate for land be sold at the Land Office, except to actual settlers upon the same, and in lots not ex-ceeding one hundred and sixty acres, pro-vided that the Legislature shall not grant out of the public domain more than twen-ty sections of land for each mile of com-pleted work in aid of the construction of ty sections of land for each mile of com-pleted work in aid of the construction of which, land may be granted; and provid-ed further, that nothing in the foregoing provise shall effect any rights, granted or secured by laws passed prior to the final adoption of this amendment."

Now, therefore, I, EDMUND J. DAVIS, Governor of Texas, by virtue of the author-ity vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of this State, do hereby order and direct that the said election to vote on the

direct that the said election to vote on the said proposed amendment to the constitu-tion of this State be held at the same time tion of this State be held at the same time and places for voting as at the next gene ral rection, viz: at the county seat of each county, and commencing on the first Treeday after the first Monday in November, A. D. 1879, and continuing four consecutive days, viz: the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth day of November, A. D. 1879. The returning officers at said general election, shall open a poll for and make a return to the Secretary of State of the names of all those voting for Representatives, who have troted on the proposed amendment to section 6 of article 10 of the constitution. in accordance with law, that

amendment to section 6 of article 10 of the constitution, in accordance with law, the hallots used by voters to have written or printed on them the words "for the amendment," or "against the amendment."

The attention of officers of the law, voters and others, is called to the provisions of the law of this State and the United States, enseted to score the free exercise of the rights of suffrage, and the punishment of those, who may in any manner attempt to interfere with this franchise.
