OFFICIAL LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES

Passed at the Second Session of the Forty-Second Congress.

[CONTINUED.] [GENERAL NATURE No. 111.] AN ACT to reduce duties on imports, and to reduce internal taxes, and for other purposes.

Sec. 40. That section sixty-three of the act approved July thirteenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, entitled "An act to reduce internal taxation, and to amend an act entitled 'An act to provide internal revenue to support the government, to pay interest on the public debt, and for other purposes,' approved July thirteenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, and act amendatory thereof," be amended by striking out the words "three hundred" wherever they occur therein, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "five hundred" of the provisions of this act, or of any act to which this is an amendment, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "under any of the provisions of any internal-revenue act."

Sec. 41. That section one hundred and sixty-one of the act entitled "An act to provide internal-revenue to support the government, to pay interest on the public debt, and for other purposes," approved June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, be amended by striking out the words "this act," occurring after the words "stamp issued under the provisions of," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "any internal-revenue act."

Sec. 42. That all internal taxes now assessed or liable to be assessed against, but not collected from, shipbuilders as manufacturers, under section four of the act of March thirtieth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "An act to exempt certain manufacturers from internal tax, and for other purposes," for sales of vessels, be, and the same are hereby, remitted, and no further assessments shall be made on account thereof.

Sec. 43. That prior to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, it shall be the duty of the President, and he is hereby authorized and directed, to reduce the internal revenue districts in the United States to not exceeding eighty in number, and for that purpose he may unite two or more districts, or States, or Territories, into one district, and he shall designate from among the existing revenue-officers one collector and one assessor for each new district, or at his discretion he may, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, nominate and appoint new officers for such new districts; and the collector and assessor so designated or appointed shall give bond according to law, and the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized to require, prior to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, to reduce the number of internal-revenue assistant assessors, inspectors, gaugers, store-keepers, and the clerks and assistants of the same, to such number as shall be determined by the Secretary of the Treasury, and that he report to Congress at his next session the reduction made, and under the same, and such changes in the organization of the internal-revenue service as will promote its efficiency and economy.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 112.] AN ACT making appropriations for the support of the army for the year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-three and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums be, and the same are hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the support of the army for the year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-three:

For expenses of the Commanding General's Office, five thousand dollars. For expenses of recruiting and transportation of recruits, one hundred and twenty thousand five hundred and eighty dollars. For contingent expenses of the Adjutant General's department at the headquarters of military divisions and departments, five thousand dollars.

For the expenses of the signal-service of the army, twelve thousand five hundred dollars. For pay of the army, and for payment to discharged soldiers for clothing not drawn, twelve million one hundred and six thousand five hundred and ninety-one dollars and thirty-two cents.

For allowances to officers of the army for transportation of themselves and their baggage, when traveling on duty, without troops, escorts or supplies, two hundred and forty thousand dollars. For general expenses, such as the compensation of witnesses while on court-martial service, and traveling expenses of paymaster's clerks, and postage on letters, orders, and memoranda received and sent by officers of the army on public business, military commission and courts of inquiry, one hundred thousand dollars.

For subsistence of regular troops, engine companies, and Indian scouts, two million seven hundred and seventy thousand nine hundred and forty-four dollars. For regular supplies of the Quartermaster's department, to wit: For the regular supplies of the Quartermaster's department, consisting of fuel for officers, enlisted men, garrisons, hospitals, storehouses, and offices; of forage in kind for the horses, mules, and oxen of the Quartermaster's department, at the several posts and stations, and with the armies in the field; for the horses of the several regiments of cavalry, the batteries of artillery, and such companies of infantry and scouts as may be mounted, and for the authorized number of officers' horses, including bedding for the animals; for straw for soldiers' bedding; of Stationery, including blank forms for the Quartermaster's department, certificates for discharged soldiers, blank forms for the Pay and Quartermaster's departments, and for printing of division and department orders and reports, four million dollars.
