A Gambler's Death-bed.
We copy as follows from the
Shreveport Times:
A long-time resident furnishes us
with the following from his scrap book:
Many years ago there lived in
the town of Shreveport a class of
men very fond of a little game of
draw. One of the party took sick
and lay unto death, and being
counted of a jovial disposition,
his loss would cause regrets—all
his friends were therefore with him
during his sickness. Now O. L.
was very facetious when he was in
a streak, and had a singular quaint
saying, whenever he raked down the
pot, which ran thusly: "Damn a
man that would scare a horse, and
throw a boy, and break a five gal-
lon jug of the best old rye." This
was also attended with peculiar
gestures—cocked expression of the
eye and raised hand, and the fin-
gers expanded over the pot ready
to rake. So ridiculous was this po-
sition and expression that it was
really gratifying for the others to
lose occasionally, that the monotony
of the game might be interrupted
by a hearty laugh. The disease
that O. was laboring under proved
too much for his constitution, and
the last day was passed hunting
around in a half delirious state,
when he struck a little game of draw
—his friends seeing that he was de-
termined on trying his luck, bolster-
ed him up. At first he was not
very lucky, but soon on his two
pairs and threes would call out his
favorite expressions, and it was not
very long before the game became
very exciting. O's hand was com-
posed of flushes, fulls etc., and the
jugatory was frequently repeated.
He became gradually very boisterous
and much excited over his luck.
Some five or six of his old friends
were crowded around his death bed
and eagerly watching the progress
of the imaginary game; even the
doctor had got stuck at it. At
length he raised a hand and in wild
excitement he exclaimed: "Four
white aces, by George!" The game
ceased immediately—his arms fell
by his side—O. had passed in his
checks. That hand was too heavy;
the silver cord had broken. The
party were much affected by the
sudden termination of the game.
One of them, an elderly person
somewhat given to stooping, and
when troubled would walk with his
hands clasped behind him and head
down—a favorite attitude—immedi-
ately commenced pacing the room
and shaking his head slowly. After
a few moments silence, he remark-
ed in his peculiar voice: "boys, if
Oscar don't get in on that hand,
none of the rest of us need try."

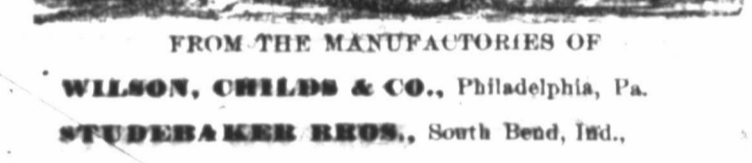
