GENERAL NATURE No. 118. AN ACT to create the Linkton Land District, in the State of Oregon.

That all that portion of the State of Oragon, by ing south of the base-line, between townships eighteen and nineteen south, and east of the meridian line between ranges five and sax in said State, shall constitute an additional land district, to be called the Linkton district; and the office of said district shall be located as Linktille, subless to be ton district; and the omce or said district shall be located at Linkville, subject to be chadged by the President of the United States as the public interests may require. Sec. 2. That the President be, and he is hereby, authorized to appoint, in accordance with existing laws authorizing appointments to office a register and a reance with aristing laws authorizing appointments to office, a register and a receiver for the district heraby created, who shall each be required to reside at the site of the office for said district, have the same powers, responsibilities, and emoluments, and be subject to the same acts and penalties which are or may be prescibed by law in relation to other land officers of the United States for the State of Oregon.

That all sales and locations made at the offices of the district in which the lands embraced in this district have higher to been included, situate within the limits of this district, which shall be valid and right in other respects up to the day on which the new office shall go into operation, be, and the same are hereby confirmed.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That any person or persons bidding for the transportation of the mails upon any route which may be advertised to be let, and receiving an award of the contract for such service, who shall wrongfully refu so or fail to enter into contract with the postmaster general, in due form, and perform the service described in his or their bid or proposal, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding five thousand dellars, and by imprisonment for a term not ex

That each bid for carrying the mail shall bereafter have affixed to it the oath of the bidder, taken before an officer qualified to administer oaths, that he has the ability pecuniarily to fulfill his obligations, and that the bid is made in good faith and with the intention te enter into contract and perform the service, in case. offer the same at the following prices:
