Shall we have a Rail-road!

There is evidently considerable excitement among our business men concerning the rail-road question.

Every body concedes the necessity of securing at the earliest possible moment rail-way connection with the rest of the country.

Without it we shall drag along in the old grooves with diminishing instead of increasing prospects.

It is really of little moment in which direction we obtain outlet; the great thing to be accomplished is to obtain the steam high-way.

Apparently, one way is as good as another—for the present at least. We have a suggestion to make.

The International has a subsidy from the State of \$10,000 per mile; and in addition a land subsidy.

Let our citizens offer to build the road between here and Austin upon condition that they shall have the benefit of the subsidy.

The Company cannot ask anything more, and we believe there is enough capital and energy in San Antonio, if aroused to the work, to build the road within a twelve months.

A million of dollars is asked by the International—let us try the Yankee on it and make an offer.

A railroad we are bound to have or go into bankruptcy. This is just what's the matter.

Adios Morgan.

The recent rail-road talk in this city originated a private telegram to Mr. Charles Morgan—the inquiry being, "what are you going to do?"

Mr. Morgan replies in substance, "I have furnished money to build the road to Quero, somebody else must furnish money to build it beyond that point." Here is a nut to crack.

There is no mistaking the hard shell of it. Crack it if you can. It seems to us that Morgan would have made more money by completing his road to this city, instead of stopping at Quero, with the effort to build up what is sure to be an ephemeral town there.

The enormous freight centering here would pay for building the road.

But we have the fact, nevertheless, staring us in the face. Morgan will do nothing more. Very well, let us do nothing more for him. He has plundered the people of West

ern Texas of every dollar he owns. He has never failed to demand the pound of flesh. It is time for our people to pay him back in his own coin. If we are compelled to build a rail-road at our own cost let us do so, but not to enrich these rail-road sharks. We can build a narrow gauge road to the gulf and equip and own it for the money that we would have to pay to complete Morgan's road to this city. Let him slide. If we mistake not there is a favorable charter on our statute book which we can operate under and render Mr. Morgan's Quero schemes nugatory and profitless. Who will move in the matter? Snub, squelch the old blout—that is the true plan.

Let us build a road to the gulf on our own hooks—and put an end to these impertinent beggars for millions of tribute.

Political Humbuggery.

Every now and then we read an account of a riot growing out of a political parade in some large city.

One party or the other expends large sums of money in the purchase of uniforms, torch-lights, music, &c. &c., and then go bravely marching round the town to the great inconvenience and annoyance of every one whose political opinions are not centered either in his heels or his uniform.

It is almost as inevitable as fate that a procession of colored men in uniform in any large city awakens disturbance, and generally results fatally to one or more. It is the same in religious processions—particularly among the Irish. Never an Orange procession but creates a riot.

It seems to us that this method of political demonstration is a costly, insupportable, and unprofitable nuisance. The men whose votes are secured for either party thereby are few in number and by no means reliable. The still stream has the deepest and strongest current—the babbling brook is shallow, and bubbles because of its innumerable obstructions, and its shallowness. If you will take notice of the men whose energies are devoted to getting up promoting such demonstrations, you will find them of that class who cast well ahead in order to be on the winning side. Little do they care for the success of any principle. They scarcely know the meaning of principle in politics. Party success is the all in all with them. With assured success they would as soon carry a torch for one party as another. And when all is done they claim credit for having organized and led the party to victory!—and demand an office! Bah! This making of night hideous by the rushing of imbecile men and unruly boys through the streets of a city, at night never fixed a principle or made a worthy vote. Something of ostentation and display may be very well on extraordinary occasions; but the occasion must present itself first, the display afterward. It is not ginger-pop or lager-beer commotion we want;—it is the earnest, strong spirit of intelligent belief. This may be strengthened by club meetings, drills, uniforms, parades, pole-raising, flag-hoistings, and stump harangues;—but the substantial work—the winning—is done otherwise and is more meritorious.

Noise from Washington.

The Campaign.—A sudden collapse of the Greeley Fizzle.—Effect of the State Elections.—A formal canvass but no enthusiasm.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 11th, 1872.

The Greeley nomination is breaking up and falling to pieces very rapidly. The Democratic portion of the coalition never felt any strong attachment to their standard bearer; and since the results of the North Carolina, Vermont and Maine elections have been announced, they are hastily dissolving the union with the declaration that they were not bound to respect the Baltimore nomination of a man for whom they had no respect or affinity. A very intelligent Democrat remarked to your correspondent yesterday that "It is no use; Greeley cannot draw the Democratic vote, and the game is up," and in further conversation he said that was the general feeling among the leaders of the opposition.

Well, it is only what was expected. The Democratic party may be somewhat unscrupulous in their efforts to defeat the Administration, but to ask them to endorse a vote for and support their life-long enemy, is requiring of them more than could possibly be expected from a party not wholly bereft of the principles of political honesty and consistency. A man's political convictions are supposed to be, and usually are, the result of intelligent enquiry; and a conscientious man would not more part with them than he would dispose of his right arm. Greeley was aware of this when he asked for Democratic support, and now that he has utterly failed, and fallen between two stools, there is very little sympathy for him. The Democratic support has abandoned him with a suddenness that will conduce to make him a piper man in the future.

The Maine election is a terrible shock. The Tribune had informed its readers a week before the election that the State would go Republican by just about 8,000 majority; but the election is over and the Tribune comes to the Republicans a majority of 18,000. The Republicans party themselves did not anticipate over 12,000 majority, but they have carried victory into every county and district in the State, and rallied up a full majority of 18,000. The effect upon the coalition is damaging in the extreme, and could it be done with any show of honor, the opposition would retire immediately from the contest. This they cannot however do, and a show of speakers will be kept up in the different States for some time to come.

It is a fortunate thing not only for the country but for President Grant and the Republican party, that the opposition was started with a flourish of trumpets. It will be remembered that for two years past Grant and his acts and motives, as well as those of his Cabinet, have been misrepresented and calumniated, that the people began to believe that all was not right. The canvass has brought out the facts. The charges have been met and their falsity exposed, and to-day President Grant and his Cabinet have the full confidence of every honest, unprejudiced man in the Union, while the false statements of the opposition are allowed to pass for what they are worth and no more.

In Pennsylvania the Grant stock has gone up rapidly and the best informed in the State are confident of giving him forty to fifty thousand majority. New York, hitherto upon a pretty even balance, has it is claimed, wheeled into line, and will show a solid front for Grant. And the reports from all parts indicate that the Republican ticket everywhere is largely on the increase.

LOCAL AFFAIRS.

THERE has been made a change in the arrival and departure of the Austin mails. The mail to Austin will hereafter leave every day at 10 o'clock, M., Sundays excepted.

WISHING to take a ride to the races on Saturday, we improved a proof reader for the inside matter of Sunday's issue; and when we saw the numerous errors on Sunday morning, we did not bludgeon because we do not mean to vote for Greeley, and because we believe in resting on Sunday.

THE trotting match of Saturday at the San Pedro Springs was not quite so exciting as we have seen at Dexter Park, or the Metairie course, and as other celebrated race courses. Chucker won the match easily, time first round, half mile, 2:43; second time 2:48. The bay broke and scattered in the most Greeley like fashion, and was evidently trying to reform the old fashioned way of trotting; but he did not reform worth a cent.

THE following is excerpted from a private letter of a gentleman well known in this city, to a merchant firm here, and we cannot do it justice. He writes from the seat of war, almost, and we believe his statements are reliable upon.

THE latest news from Chihuahua is that General Diaz and General Carr are still at that place, and that General Trevino with his army is falling back to Chihuahua to join all their forces.

General Rodas is said to be in pursuit of Trevino with 6000 men. General Trevino has 2000 men, Gomez and Diaz about the same. Chihuahua, from all accounts, will be the seat of war, and perhaps the final battle of the revolution. Quis sabe?

Governor Serrano is still at Conception, with perhaps 1000 men, and all is quiet here, but we are looking forward for a call for the help of our men.

A General Court Martial will convene at Fort Gibson, Indian Territory, on Monday, September 30th, 1872.

San Antonio arsenal, San Antonio, Texas: For taking down walls and rebuilding with cut stone the building used as an armory shop, nine thousand dollars; for erecting frame storehouse, one hundred dollars; for building a cistern to supply the post with water, two thousand dollars; for repairing and painting public buildings and fences, one thousand dollars; in all, sixteen thousand dollars.
