European Notes.
A terrible accident happened on
the morning of Oct. 2nd near Car-
lisle, the capital of Cumberland
Mise, England. A passenger train,
running at a very rapid speed, colli-
ded with a freight train, on the E. R.
connecting the city of London with
Edinburgh. Eleven persons were
killed—many more injured.

FROM Alsace and Lorraine, the
departments of persons, who prefer
any sacrifice to the assumption of
German citizenship, are upon an
immense scale. It is by hundreds
of thousands that they may be
counted. During the last fortnight
of September 18,000 left one city—
Metz—to seek homes under French
jurisdiction.

Metz has only now a population
of 10,000.

THE death of Dr. Francis Lieber
creates a vacancy in the Mexican
Claims Commission. As the Indian
cases amount to \$32,000,000 the fill-
ing of this vacancy is a matter of
considerable solicitude, and may
lead to trouble.

There is, indeed, but one side to
this question; and the evidence laid
before the commission settles con-
clusively the fact that the Ameri-
can settlers on the Rio Grande fron-
tier have been subjected to a long
course of robbery and rapine, and
that last spring it reached a point
when it became necessary to call
upon the Government to repel the
invaders, robbers, and murderers,
and also to send a commission to
report the condition of affairs on
that border. It appears that not
only did the Mexican Government
refuse to take measures to prevent
further outrages, but placed in com-
mand of the line of the border
General Cortinas, the most accom-
plished cut-throat and cattle thief
that country ever produced. It ap-
pears also that there have been
found from time to time, by various
grand juries in the counties of Cam-
erun, Hidalgo and Starr, over one
hundred indictments for murder,
arson, and cattle stealing in these
counties; and further, that it has
been proved before this commission
that this Mexican commandant,
since his elevation to the rank of
brigadier, sent his troops into Tex-
as armed and uniformed, for the
purpose of driving his old trade
of indiscriminate robbery and mur-
der.

Claims, supported by abundant
testimony, were filed before the
commission, showing that during
the past six years the people west
of the Nueces, have had stolen from
them by Mexican bandits, over six
million dollars, worth of stock and
other property, and that in that
time over three hundred American
citizens have paid with their lives
the penalty of defending their homes
and hard earned means from these
marauders. At least one-half of
these outrages were proved to have
been instigated and conducted by
General Cortinas. General McCook,
commanding the 10th United States
Infantry, and who has been station-
ed on the frontier for the past four
years, testified to the numerous in-
vasions and outrages which came
directly under his own observation,
and also to his inability to afford
protection to the people with the
limited force under his command.
His testimony fully substantiated
the charges preferred by the people
against the Mexican commander,
and connects this robber chief with
most of the murders and outrages
committed upon the people of West-
ern Texas.

This we understand to be the
condition of things on the Mexican
border and the substance of the tes-
timony laid before the commission.
We hesitate not to say that Mexi-
can insolence and murder should be
promptly checked, and ample pro-
tection be given to the outraged
frontiersmen; and it may not be
presuming too far to predict that
Congress will, when next convened,
and the report of the Commission
is laid before this body, take ac-
tion in this grave matter, and teach
these barbarians on the border and
their more polished masters at Mexi-
co City, that the invasion of our
territory, the commission of arson,
that and murder must cease at once,
that compensation for the past
must be made and the future peace
of the Texas frontier be guaranteed.

After some threats of Sanders, on
Friday Wilson undertook to make
his arrest, when Sanders presented
his derringer and threatened death
to the Marshal if he did not. Wil-
son, being unarmed, went out of the
saloon, and as he did so, said to
Sanders, "Bill, I will arrest you
yet," and going to the Mayor, a
warrant was placed in the Marshal's
hands, who then procured a double-
barreled shot gun and carefully
loading both barrels with squirrel
shot, he went in search of Sanders,
and found him at the foot of the
stairs leading into the old Herald
office. He demanded his arms, say-
ing that he had a warrant for his
arrest. Sanders instantly drew his
pistol and attempted to shoot; at
the same time Wilson told him to
drop his pistol, but he gave no heed
to the warning, and had it almost
on a level with Wilson's breast
when Wilson fired one barrel of his
gun, the shot entering on the right
side, right nipple, and passing through
lodged in the left side a little below
the point of entrance on the other
side. He fell, exclaiming: "I am a
dead man!" He was then taken in
charge by friends and four surgeons
summoned, but death had entered
in at that wound, which was about
an inch and a half across. He lived
thirty minutes, and remarked to
take heed, that whisky had brought
him to what he was.

Wilson gave himself up to the
Sheriff, and has been around town
ever since. The sympathies of the
people are with Wilson. Circuit
Court meets to-day and something
may be done. Good for Wilson.
Let all such men be served the same
way.—The Chicago Evening Journal.
