

In less than half an our the fact was telegraphed to the ex reme boundaries of the national downing and communicated almost simultaneously to forty millions of people, each of whom felt, if he did not express the fact, that another of our most illustrious statesmen had ored and beloved by an entire nation. He leaves behind him no single individual City and Country Merchants. whose statesmanship has been productive of so much good and such decided results

to the nation. During his collegiate years Mr. Seward pent six months in Georgia teaching school. Here he first received his impres sions in regard to slavery, and ever afte he was a consistent advecate of emancipation. Soon after his return to New York he defended the cause of liberty in a hope when the next city nomina | Fourth of July eration before the people tions are made, the people may be at Syracuse, and announced ideas which he persistently entertained and advocated until slavery was abolished by Congress. -In 1898 he was offered and declined nomination for Congress. But his enlarged and active mind displayed itself in

advocating new and important State and National measures, and in evidences of statesmanship that attracted popular attention. Internal improvements, education, reform in the militia, opposition to corporate monopolies, were among the measures advocated. In 1838 he was elected Governor of New York by the Whig party, and many of his measures were endorsed and incorporated into the laws of his State. Among these were the extension of public education, presecution of the public works and the removal of disabilities of foreigners. During his administration imprisonment for debt in New York State was abolished, and the last vestige of slavery was obliterated from the statute books. He was re-elected in 1840, retiring afterwards to resume the practice of law. He advecated Henry Clay's election to the Presidency in 1844

He was then sent to the United States Senate, succeeding Gen. Dix, and became the leader of Mr. Taylor's Administration. He took a firm stand against further concessions to the slave power, declaring in a speech in 1850, on the admission of Call furnia, that " there is a higher law than the Constitution which regulates our suthority over the domain." His speeches during his Senatorial labors were characterized by great discrimination and distin ed knowledge of both. If we are guished ability. 
