GRASSES.—A correspondent in Ment-gomery reports to the Agricultural Depart-ment that the Freecus grass proves to be of great value. He states that on less than two acres of it he pastured four mules and two milch cows, besides hogs, through the whole winter, and adds that there is a per ceptible difference in the flavor of milk and

Another correspondent at Victoria, Tex. writes that the Calafornia clover is doing well. It was then 16 inches high, with burs or seed-pods at every joint, the joints being about one inch and a half apart At each of these there springs up a flower stalk half an inch in length, terminating in a cluster of small yellow flower, from four to six is number, from which the burgare formed. These runners or atoms grow to three or four feet in length, putting Taterals, jointed like the main stock, and filled with seed pods which cover the sorface of the ground from one to three inches deep, and of which both towls and animals are exceedingly fond.
