noxious to the Democracy.

We have just received a private letter from a gentleman thoroughly conversant with the situation in New York and New Jersey, and he says New York will go overwhelmingly for Grant; and that, although the Times puts New Jersey down as doubtful, he is certain it will give Grant a majority of about 10,000. He thinks the whole North is going solid for the re-election of the man whom they have tried, and not "found wanting," in preference to the crochety, speculative politician, no matter how good his intentions may be. And there is just where we think safety lies.

Political Speech Making.

It is always easier to criticize any performance than to do the work properly one's self. The very ablest critics can show you the faults of a book or poem, a drama of the stage or of music, and yet be utterly incapable of accomplishing anything respectable in any one of these arts. Indeed, the critic is like the poet "nascitur non fit"; and therefore it is that you often find one of the most impractical persons in the world bestowing the most judicious and accurate praise or blame. We do not profess to possess this faculty to any considerable degree, but we do think that modern political oratory, as a general thing, has become corrupted, not only in style, but in matter. The object apparently uppermost in the minds of the speakers seems to be, to tickle the fancy, and win the applause, of the extreme partisans coinciding with the speaker's views. There are, of course, exceptional orators who resort to argument, and strike home not only by their power of reason, but by happy illustration, genuine facts, and pure eloquence. But such speakers are rare. In general you listen to mock-angry abuse, or exaggerated praise, to personalities which would disgrace any other social combination in life than that of the "stump," to the tricks of the pettifogger, and the baneful clap-trap of the patent medicine vendor. Such oratory rarely converts a skeptic or confirms a believer. It may entertain a certain class always foreordained to be entertained by anything pertaining of humbuggery or no-nonsense; but it exerts no active influence over intelligent minds. The object of these speeches ought always to be, to persuade your opponents that your cause is the just and right one; that it is their interest as much as yours to support it; and that the welfare of the people depends upon the success of the principles you advocate. Intemperate abuse of your political opponent may arouse the violent, and alarm the timid; but it will not persuade your cause.

We venture to say, in all candor, that the passionate violence of Judge Hancock's speech made in this city a few weeks ago, gained the Republican cause a large number of votes. He galloped through his tirade like a mad bullock tearing through the streets of a town; but such bullocks generally pull up at the slaughter house—just as Mr. Hancock will pull up at the end of his rope. We trust our own public speakers will not allow themselves to be dragged into such a number of speeches.

But there is another class of oratory equally insane and unprofitable. They imagine that they are the lights of the party to which they adhere—the salt which preserves it from decay, and the great expositors of its creed, its canons and dogmas. These are generally new converts, and like all new converts are extravagantly zealous. They bestow more attention upon the men in the ranks of their own party than those in the opposition. Do they improvise a little music of their own, and some old soldier slugs his shoulders, and falls to step to suit them if they are immediately clamorous for a drum-head court martial and quick death—or banishment—an order to go over into the enemies lines. They are always the blindest talkers and the lightest thinkers. Any rational, dispassionate consideration of the situation is impossible to them. They seem always less concerned about winning a battle than in having their own way—or at least making everybody believe they are having it. Such busy orators do probably more mischief than any others; because without possessing prominence they seem to possess it; without being leaders they proclaim themselves such, while the real captains are quietly planning the campaign.

Notes from Washington.

The Political Outlook—Election Returns—Public Feeling—The Rio Grande Commissioners—Prompt Action Anticipated—The Future of Mexico.

WASHINGTON, D. C., October 19th, 1872. THE POLITICAL OUTLOOK. The Pennsylvania and Ohio elections have given the Greeley "liberal" party a crushing success of their extreme presumption and folly. They had evidently persuaded themselves that they would carry the local elections in those States. When the vote was announced the effect was like an electrical shock. The Central committee in Washington immediately closed their rooms in the Capitol, and stopped the presses upon which campaign documents were being run off. This is a fact, though attempts have been made to deny it. In fact they are out of funds, and no contributions are coming in. Capitalists in New York have refused further advances, and heavy bills remain unpaid for printing, painting banners, &c.

Here in Washington, as well as elsewhere, the Democracy are denouncing the "Liberals" for deceiving them as to their strength. On the other hand the Liberals attribute their defeat to the indifference of their allies, and a very unpleasant state of feeling has been created between the two wings of the opposition. The Republicans have not abated their zeal. The field is still occupied, though not perhaps so thoroughly, by our ablest speakers, and the committee in Washington are as busily as ever, engaged in filling orders from State committees for documents bearing upon the federal election. The official returns from Pennsylvania have run the Republican majority up to 35,445! There has been nothing like that in the Keystone State for very many years. It has surprised the most hopeful; and indicates beyond doubt a majority for Grant of over 50,000.

The majority in Ohio has been run up to 10,000, and this too is largely ahead of what was expected. Ohio is good for 26,000 majority for Grant. This I have from gentlemen just returned from the State canvass. Indiana has elected Mr. Hendricks, Democratic Governor. He is a good man and immensely popular, and on this ground alone he secured his election; but poor Voorhees has been laid aside. It will be remembered that he at first opposed Greeley, and then supported him, thus denigrating his own supporters by his inconsistency. Already the Republicans have gained thirteen Congressmen by the election; for the 43rd Congress thus far held. It is more than probable that the number will be doubled by the State elections yet to come off, giving them more than a two-thirds majority.

RETURN OF THE RIO GRANDE COMMISSION. The commissioners authorized to investigate the outrages upon the Texas frontier, have returned with their report. It reveals a state of affairs upon the border that will require the immediate attention and prompt action of Congress and the Executive. The Commissioners have had several interviews with the President, and the subject has been under consideration in the Cabinet. The President will give the matter special consideration in his annual message to Congress; but it is not known publicly what policy he will recommend. There will probably be further consultation with leading officials, both here and in Texas, before a line of policy is finally decided upon. But be assured that decisive measures will be adopted and carried out to the letter. The immense amount of property already wrested from citizens of Texas, to say nothing of the loss of life, and the continual danger in which the people on the border are living, demands this; and whatever authority and instructions Congress give to the Executive, will be immediately carried into execution. Mexico itself is evidently again hastening to a condition of lawlessness and anarchy, and it need not be a matter of surprise if Texas shall soon find herself no longer a border State in the Union. The feeling of antagonism is becoming stronger every day, here and elsewhere, through the American Union; and I find two that the English and Canadian press are repeating frequently the settled opinion that a movement on the part of the American government looking to the final annexation of Mexico, would be a source of satisfaction throughout the entire extent of civilization. At all events the subject is worthy of thought, and of discussion by the newspaper press throughout the American Union. Congress will be governed largely in its action by the expressed public sentiment. O. S. T.

Whatever may be said of the evils and corruptions of political parties, their existence is essential to the preservation of our liberties, and history and reason both indicate that there must be at least two in every representative government. While it may be said that parties have their periods of infamy, growth, usefulness and decay, the life of a party should depend upon its patriotism and its fidelity to correct principles. It is just as important that a good and patriotic party should be preserved, as that a wicked and corrupt party should be destroyed. The Republican party is strong and vigorous, and by the testimony of its foes it has been faithful to the great trusts blighted imposed in it. The Democratic party still maintains its organization, and claims a voting strength of 3,000,000. If the Republican party is to be set aside, another party will inevitably take its place—and that will be the Democratic party. Is any one foolish enough to imagine that the temporary coalition patched up between a few disaffected Republicans and the Democratic leaders has any element of permanence about it? As well look for domestic felicity and an orderly, virtuous household as the result of a free love attachment based upon a temporary affinity and personal attraction. Should the great fraud succeed, and Honore Greeley be installed in the White House, he would become a De-

mocratic President, or he would be removed to make room for one who would.

So it comes at last to a choice between the two parties—the Republican and Democratic. That is the plain issue—a Republican or a Democratic administration for the next four years.

Life and Death. Few things are more confounded than the instinct of self-preservation and the fear of death. Because a man struggles for or clings to life, it does not follow that he has any dread of death. Irrational attachment often the antipodes of conscious terror. Every one of us has cause and motive to dread without a desperate struggle and exceeding pain. It is the relief of this solicitude that makes in a measure the shadows of death. We are unwilling to surrender what life contains, though we may not have the slightest fear of what death may yield; and yet many of us are so little inclined to trace our own mental operations, that we do not draw the distinction clearly. The majority of men prefer their own country and would not willingly leave it. It is to be concluded, therefore, that they are afraid of another land? It is strong inclination to one thing to be interpreted as a dread of another? Because we want to live, is it any proof that we fear to die? Life is a reality, a certainty, something experienced and tested over and over again. Death is an idea, an image, a mystery from which we shrink because it is a mystery forever impenetrable. The abridging is inherent but gives way to indifference or feigns nearness and nature makes their revelations. He who can deliver up the mortal charms of this world's being, return to death, and smile at its approach. The eye that is bent upon this life cannot see truly what lies beyond. The axis of vision is deranged by the duplex effort; but the secular objects removed, the spiritual light becomes clear. "The King of Terrors discovered," in November Galgley.

GRASSES.—A correspondent in Montgomery reports to the Agricultural Department that the Fresno grass proves to be of great value. He states that on less than two acres of it he pastured four steers and two milk cows, besides hogs, through the whole winter, and adds that there is a perceptible difference in the flavor of milk and butter after pasturage on this grass. Another correspondent at Victoria, Tex., writes that the California clover is doing well. It was then 16 inches high, with buds or seed-pods at every joint, the joints being about one inch and a half apart. As each of these there springs up a flower stalk half an inch in length, terminating in a cluster of small yellow flowers, from four to six in number, from which the buds are formed. These runners or stems grow to three or four feet in length, putting out lateral joints like the main stem, and filled with seed pods which cover the surface of the ground from one to three inches deep, and of which both tows and animals are exceedingly fond.

**ANGORA GOATS.**—Turt, Field and Farm says: The large number of these animals exhibited at the late California State Fair, held at Sacramento, shows the production of the fine fleece clipped from this variety of the Capra family is growing into an important industry, and is now considered as more important than the raising of sheep. The Angora is often misnamed, being called the Cashmere Goat. In Asia, whence the stock comes, there are nearly twenty varieties of fleece-bearing goats, and of these the pure Angora is the most valuable. It is known as the primitive goat of Asia Minor. The fleece is very valuable and is made into shawls, fringes, and various fine fabrics known as Cashmere goods. There are now in California about 70,000 of different grades of Angora blood, the first having been imported in 1861. The fleece from the pure stock commands \$1.50 per pound.
