enant of the State Police. He deserves

Tax meeting of the Democracy last  
Saturday night to hear Governor Ham-  
ilton and Mr. Sheeks was a large one, com-  
posed, as is thought to have been, of both  
parties. The torch-light procession as a  
political demonstration was a failure; the  
most of the torches being burned by ac-  
cidents, some of these while and others of  
the Mexican, African and other races—all  
for the four, five, we suppose. The number  
of actual voters in the procession did not equal  
those usual in a Republican torch light  
procession for such an occasion.

The speaking was opened by Judge  
Sheeks, who spoke energetically if not  
logically. He said President Grant had  
proved faithless to every promise he had  
given. It would puzzle Mr. Sheeks to  
point out a single instance of the faithless-  
ness charged. But what seemed to stick  
in Mr. Sheeks' mind was the fact that some  
men, charged under Greeley's, Ku Klux bill  
had been arrested and confined in North  
Carolina. He asserted they had been ar-  
rested without process of law—and gener-  
ally animated against the administration  
for executing a law whose chief ad-  
vocate was his own candidate for the Presi-  
dency. But this gentleman chiefly dis-  
tinguished himself by comparing the present  
administration of the government with  
that of the days of Buchanan and other  
very patriotic persons to the war—when  
there was no war debt to pay.

We heard yesterday morning a remark
