Election Laws of the Forty-First Congress.

"SECTION 20. And be it further enacted, That if, [at] any registration of voters for an election for representatives or delegates in the Congress of the United States, any person shall knowingly personate and register, or attempt to register, in the name of any other person, whether living, dead, or fictitious, or fraudulently register, or fraudu-lently attempt to register, not having a lawful right so to do; or do any unlawful act to secure registration for himself or any other person; or by force, threat, menace, intimidation, bribery, reward, or offer, or promise thereof, or other unlawful means, prevent or hinder any person having a lawful right to register from duly exercising such right; or compel or induce, by any such means, or other unlawful means, any officer of registration to admit to registration any person not legally entitled thereto, or interfere in any manner with any officer of registration in the discharge of his duties, or by any such means, or other unlawful means, induce any officer of registration to violate or refuse to comply with his duty or any law regulating the same; or if any such officer shall knowingly and wilfully register as a voter any person not entitled to be registered, or refuse to so register any person entitled to be registered; or if any such officer or any person whose duty it is to perform any duty in relation to such registration or election, or to ascertain, announce, or declare the result thereof, or give or make any certificate, document or evidence in relation thereto, shall knowingly neglect or refuse to perform any duty required by law, or violate any duty imposed by law,

The practice of scolding children for trivial offenses, is one which the common sense of thoughtful people naturally condemns. There is another method pursued by many, equally injurious. A child receives a little hurt; the mother, anxious to do something for it immediately, and not knowing what to do, takes the little creature in her arms and pets it, saying, "Oh, naughty hurt, poor child, too bad, little thing is hurt, and such like expressions. Now this is all wrong. The child in this way learns to magnify the little ills of life, and gets into a bad habit that cliugs to it always. The more philosophical course to pursue is the reverse of this, to attract the child's mind to other things, when unless the hurt is severe, it soon forgets it and is ready to laugh for joy. The same course may be pursued by older children. It one has trouble, the worst thing in the world to do is to think about it. The next worst thing is to try and force the trouble out of your mind by willing it to be gone. The true course to pursue is to think of something else. It is only the disciplin ed mind that can do this, and this discipline should be fully exercised in childhood. The most unpleasant part of education is this training of the will. The same rule may be applied to invalids. They should think of their aches and pains as little as possible, otherwise they appear worse than they are .-Give an invalid something outside of his own trials, and the cure is nearly complete. - The Herald of


