**Headline in Miniature.**  
**Beneficial Effects of Woman Suffrage in Wyoming.**  
Laramie City, is one of the most inviting in its appearance of all the new cities we have seen since leaving Omaha, and the people are of an excellent class. One feels at home as soon as he gets here, and no longer feels it a wonder that people are content to live away from home among the Rocky Mountains. The fact is, since the opening of the Pacific Railroad, this and the other places along its line, once so far away, are now comparatively near even to the Atlantic. There is one thing which, perhaps, explains the admirable condition of society in Wyoming Territory, and that is, they vote at the same time and places as the men; and we are told that there is no commotion or confusion at the polls. On the contrary, the highest respect is shown by the men to the women voters, and we are assured that if any one should offer the slightest disrespect or insult to a woman at the polls, he would be summarily dealt with on the spot. Women act as jurors, and one gentleman who was instrumental in bringing about this state of things gave us an interesting account of the moral influence which women jurors have exerted over those of the sterner sex. It appears that the woman, mindful of her high duties and solemn responsibilities, to prepare themselves for the work of each day by humbly seeking Divine assistance, by prayer—a service which it was understood was not specially observed by the men. The result was, however, that in a short time all the jurors began the duties of the day by joining in the religious services of the morning. Our informant also told us that a Western man never brings forward the argument that the voting by women is going to occasion discord and unhappiness in the family. He would be ashamed to thereby admit that he was unwilling to have his wife hold opinions, lest they might differ from his own; and a Western man never brings forward the argument, or statement that there is no place for women at the polls. Besides the virtues of the Union if not the persons there assembled, for he would be ashamed to thereby admit that he or the masses of his sex are not fit to meet women in public. And the woman question seems to be nearly settled for the present in Wyoming, at least in Laramie City. I ought to add that one happy result of the prominent place which has been accorded to woman in Laramie has been to entirely rid the place of drink-saloons, women of questionable character, blacklegs, and the whole race of prominent candidates for the prison and the halter.

**The Village Bar Room as it Was.**  
One of the best things in an address delivered before the Pioneer Central Association of Central New York, last week, by Gov. Seymour, was the exaltation of the educational value of an institution which has become nearly extinct in these days of railroads, viz., the village bar room, or rather, the company that used to assemble nightly at that place of universal resort. Here is the picture which Mr. Seymour drew of that old style training school.  
"Ordinarily he who kept a house of public entertainment was a man of larger means and generally more consideration than most of his neighbors. And when they gathered around that fire, the clergyman, the lawyer, the doctor, the mechanic, to discuss things, they heard both sides of questions. They were not the men of our newspapers, the men that we are so much afflicted with to-day, that see clearly because they see but one side of the question, and therefore never have any problems to settle in their own minds. Mistakes were then discussed in the hearing of all by their brightest minds. There was a collision of mind and sentiment; there was an argument upon both sides. A man could not in those days indulge in that kind of declamation and loose statement of which we hear so much to-day, for he had a wary and sharp opponent to hold him close to the truth. Then, too, in regard to business, the best men of business gathered together, and all the transactions of the country were substantially done in public. The young man stood near the large fireplace and listened to those words. The poor man, the unfriended youth who had no other means of education, used to listen to these discussions, and perhaps there learned the truths of good conduct, of skill, of business affairs, that in after life made him a successful man. To make clear what I mean, I remember when, in the days of Philip Rost, there used to be a gathering in the public room of the Syracuse House men of more sturdiness and more capacity than any similar body of men that I can call to mind. A man who could maintain for one year a high standing in that room for his good sense and ability was sure to be a pretty marked man. It required a great deal more sense than to be a member of Congress then or now.

**One of the most remarkable relics in the neighborhood of the City of Mexico was destroyed by fire early in the summer—the grand old cypress hung with mosses, well known to travelers by the name of the Arbol de la Noche Triste, or Tree of the Sad Night, under which Cortes is said to have passed the night of July 1, 1519, after his defeat by the Aztec forces. It is unknown whether it was set on fire purposely or by accident. The tree was one of the largest of its kind. It stood by the wayside. A portion of the trunk was hewn away some years since, and sent to the Naval Museum of Madrid, where it is preserved with great care.**
